Freight Collision.

Freight train No. 222, northbound, in charge of Conductor Minkler, ran into the rear end of freight No. 226 Thursday afternoon in the Southern Pacific yard, just south of the passenger depot, completely wrecking two cars, converting the caboose into kindling wood, and damaging the front end of engine No. 1385. Although both engineer and fireman stuck to their engine, no one was hurt.

According to Engineer Fish, train No. 226 was pulling out of the yard, and the rear brakeman had given him the signal to come ahead, when suddenly it stopped, and he was unable to stop his train in time to avoid a collision.

The rear brakeman on train No. 226 said to a Journal reporter that he signalled the train following to come ahead, but he could give no reason for the sudden stop of his own train.

The wreck occurred in about the same place as the one of a year ago, when the northbound overland was derailed, and both engineer and fireman killed. Engineer Fish of yesterday's wreck is the father of the fireman killed in the wreck of a year ago.

By prompt and well-directed work the crews cleared the track before the northbound overland arrived.

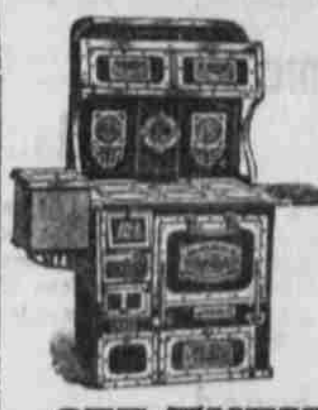
