JUST A FEW BERRIES

Hood River Estimates for 1903

Will Ship 125 Carloads or About 1250 Tons

Just Think of Tackling that Pile with a Teaspoon

Grand Forks, N. D., which took 20 cars of Hood River strawberries last year, has ordered 50 cars this season. This is the number of cars arranged for by W. K. Nash, the leading wholesale fruit man of that city, who was in Hood River Monday. Mr. Nash spent several hours with G. J. Gessling, secretary of the Hood River Fruit Growers' Union, and H. F. Davidson of the Davidson Fruit company, discussing the matter of handling the fruit, and in the afternoon he was taken for a drive around the valley. Mr. Nash has been here a number of times before, but was more than well delighted with Hood River. If business would allow it he says he would make his home here. Anyway, he declares he and his wife will spend a month or so here next strawberry season.

The prevailing price for berries in the Dakota market last year ranged from \$2.75 to \$1.75, and it is expected to be about the same this year. But Mr. Nash was emphatic in his demand that the pack must be better this year than last season, when there were too many culls. The fact that tons of Wisconsin berries can be obtained very cheaply demands that Hood River berries in Dakota be nothing but first-class.

Hood River expects to ship the first car about June 1. This will fit in about right with crops from Missouri and Arkansas. Texas shipped the first car April 19. This means that the markets will be clear of Southern berries by the time Hood River begins to ripen. Last year the first car left here June 3.

G. J. Gessling of the Union estimates this year's crop at 125 straight car loads, besides express shipments of first-class berries. "The growers must put no berries in the boxes," said Mr. Gessling, "which will not make five-tier berries. This is the smallest that should be put in, and if this rule is not observed, the berries will go straight to the cannery." Last year Hood River shipped 65 straight cars, or a total of 92 car loads.

The Davidson fruit company are gathering statistics on crop estimates and acreage in plants. Mr. Davidson thinks the crop will run between 80,000 and 90,000 crates. The company will operate their cannery toward the end of the season. They already have orders for all the fruit they can put up—Hood River Glacier.

American League Season Opens.

Boston, Mass., April 20.—With crowds cheering and the bands playing the champion Athletics of Philadelphia and the Boston team marched out on to the diamond shortly after 3 o'clock this afternoon. Cy Young took his place in the pitcher's box, the umpire shouted the familiar "play ball," and the American league season for 1903 was begun. The day being a holiday in Boston the attendance was such as to tax the accommodations of the grandstand and bleachers, spacious though they are. Today's game between the Philadelphia and Boston teams in this city is the only one on the American league schedule. The other teams of the league will not begin the pennant race until Wednesday when Chicago will play at St. Louis, New York at Washington and Cleveland at Detroit. That the season will be the most successful the vigorous young league has ever known is conceded by all. With New York included in the circuit the league embraces all of the largest and best baseball cities in the country. Reports from New York indicate that the metropolis is prepared to welcome the invaders as warmly as did this city. The experience here
