TERROR OF THE TRAIL

Struggling Through the Snow to Reach Tanana

Snow is Deep, Trail Narrow, and Trouble Plenty

Outfits are still leaving town for the interior and the trail is lined with horse sleds, dog sleds, man sleds, and a few pack horses. The heavy snow fall last week and the wind afterward, almost completely destroyed the trail. During the storm, however, sleds were sent out by the larger outfits to keep the trail broken, and Tuesday many outfits began moving again, though the trail was anything but in good condition.

The heavy snowfall extended far into the interior and down on Copper river and now there is from four to six feet of snow where ten days ago there was glare ice. Late advices from Copper state that the river is overflowing in many places. Just what effect this will have on Copper river and what condition of the trail will be up that stream when the outfits reach it is hard to tell. Although there are many parties yet on this side of the divide, the main camp of the Nizina crowd is about eight miles this side of Copper river. There is also a large camp just beyond the summit. It is estimated that there are between 400 and 500 men in these two camps.

A trip of only a few miles out on the trail will quickly demonstrate to the uninitiated that freighting to the interior is not what it is cracked up to be. The great depth of snow and the very narrow trail causes many difficulties, and more or less serious accidents. Every time a horse sled is met, the one returning empty must necessarily put his horse off into the soft snow to let the loaded one pass, and each time a horse goes off the beaten trail he goes out of sight, so to speak. They cannot reach bottom so great is the depth of the snow, and in most cases they continue to struggle in their efforts to get back on solid footing. Horses hitched to loaded sleds also frequently get off the trail. They plunge through the soft snow, probably overturning the sled and getting further from the trail with each effort to gain a footing. It may take an hour to again get them on the trail and ready to start, and in the meantime all those behind have been compelled to wait until the blockade is raised. This is very trying on the horses. They not only cut themselves with their sharp shoes, but become exhausted plunging in the soft snow.

There has been considerable trouble with sick horses on the trail, especially those brought up this spring from Seattle. Many of them were unloaded from the boat and started out on the trail almost immediately. The sudden climatic changes caused them to catch cold, and many of them have the distemper. A number of horses have been killed along the trail, some of them with broken legs and others because they were too sick to travel.

There is no small number of men pulling in their outfits by hand or with dogs. These people also have their share of trouble. The many "chuck holes" worn out by the horse sleds make traveling very difficult and slow. Quite a number of "cheechacos" are on the trail this year, and they are experiencing no end of trouble. One party which started out this week caused no little amusement. They had an extra large horse with two sleds and with the loads piled at least four feet high on each. The horse could barely pull the load on the level and so often did they come to grief that they were half a day getting a mile out of town. Among the other things which they had as "outfit" was a heavy set of iron bound tent poles, and a foundation on which to set a campstove, consisting of a platform of inch boards 3x4 feet with heavy wooden blocks for legs and a number of tin cans on top. By the time they reach the diggings they will probably be content to string their tent on a clothes line and set their stove on the ground.

There are but few women on the trail at present, though quite a number expect to start in later.—Valdes News.

Columbus, O., April 21.—The Nell house was today the Mecca for Republican politicians from all quarters of Ohio, the occasion being a meeting of the state central committee for the purpose of naming the date and place and otherwise arranging for the holding of the state convention. There were numerous informal talks during the forenoon and the day was considerably advanced before the committeemen got together behind closed doors and began the real work of the meeting. There is a well defined idea among the party leaders here that the committee will select Columbus as the place and the second week in June as the time for holding the convention. It is likewise considered probable that Senator Hanna will deliver the keynote speech as temporary chairman of the convention and that Senator Foraker will be chosen to act as permanent chairman, following out the compromise arrangement that has been made at previous conventions of the party.
