Condition of Fruit in Western Oregon

U. S. Department of Agriculture, Climate and Grop Bulletin of the Weather Bureau, Oregon Section, for the Week Ending April 21.

General Summary.

The weather during the week has been favorable for farm work, but the nights were too cool for rapid growth. Frosts occurred frequently, and early cherries, plums, and silver prunes and peaches have been elightly damaged in the upper end of the Willamette valley and in Southern Oregon. The bulk of the fruit crop, however, is uninjured, and is generally in a very potatoes and late grain. 
