## BIRD STUDY CLUB

Interesting Spring Meetings Being Resumed

### A Good Paper on Humming Birds is Read

The Salem Bird Study Club is making good progress, and the president, Mrs. W. C. Hawley, is endeavoring to extend its sphere of usefulness in every way possible. It has been decided to resume the Friday evening meetings instead of holding sessions on Tuesday evening, and the next meeting will be held Friday evening. At a recent meeting each member was asked to contribute 10 cents toward meeting certain current expenses, and aside from this there has been no money to pay. All are invited to attend the meetings.

At the last meeting an interesting paper was read on the Humming Bird from which the Journal has been allowed to make the following extracts: The smallest bird and one that no one can mistake for another is the humming bird. The length is given as from 2 1/2 to 3 1/2 inches. Some South American hummers are as large as sparrows. Of four hundred varieties known on the western continent, only one is common in the Eastern states, the ruby throat; and in our state, the rufous. We also have three other varieties less common. Allen's humming bird, which is very like the rufous, the black chinned, which corresponds to the Eastern bird, and smallest of all birds—no inhabitant of the tropical countries excepted—is our little Lake county native, the callope humming bird.

The rufous humming bird, so named from the red on its back, is very common. The old fashioned flower garden with honeysuckle, columbine, nasturtium, gladioli, and other tube flowers, is a perfect paradise for him. Red and orange are his favorite colors, as blue is the bee's and pink the butterfly's. "Which are the best decorators among the birds?" says Blanchan. "While many show true strivings after the beautiful, one hesitates between the parula warbler and the humming bird."

Two tiny white eggs in the daintiest little nest, lichen covered and lined with white down from the pussy willows, on the branch of an evergreen, is the little hummer's home. The young are ready to fly within a week after hatching.

During the nest building and incubation, the male is aggressively on the defensive and often discloses the location of the nest. He works diligently collecting nectar and insects for the little ones but he soon goes to the mountains for a vacation, leaving his wife to bring the children when they are strong enough for the trip.

The females and young have metallic green instead of the male's rufous, and lack the beautiful gorget. The body, when bereft of feathers, is as large as the first joint of a lady's thumb and seems one mass of muscle. His annual migrations from Central America to Oregon, seem long enough but the bright flowers of the short Alaskan summers, offer him nectar in return for his help in cross fertilization and he gladly journeys on, even as far as the Arctic circle.

Says Blanchan, "Even the tiny hummingbird is a desperate fighter and will lunge his rapier-like bill, like any duelist, into the jeweled breast of an enemy at the slightest provocation. All the heat of his glowing throat seems to be transformed to his head while the fight continues, sometimes even to death—a cruel but marvelously beautiful sight as the glistening birds dart and tumble about beyond the range of peace-makers."

If you see what appears to be a humming bird about your flowers at night, be sure that it is no bird at all but a sphinx moth.
