PEOPLE OF THE DAY

Father of Irish Land Bill.

The most momentous measure so far as Ireland is concerned that has been placed before the house of commons since the home rule bill introduced by Mr. Gladstone is the new land bill presented the other day by Sir George Wyndham, chief secretary for Ireland. The situation in Ireland, which has caused persistent agitation for many generations, is due mainly to the evils of absentee landlordism, which the bill introduced by Mr. Wyndham aims to abolish. Protests against exorbitant rents resulted in the appointment of a commission in 1881. An adjustment was made which gave partial relief for a time, but it was found that the great

evil resulted from the habit of landlords of increasing rents in proportion as tenants made improvements. It was also established that the revenues of the country were going out of it never to return as a result of absentee landlordism.

The bill introduced by Mr. Wyndham provides for government aid to the tenants of Ireland, enabling them to purchase the farms. Loans will be made to the tenants, limited to \$2,500 in any one instance in the congested districts and \$5,000 elsewhere. The bill provides that the tenants will pay 2 1/2 per cent interest on loans from the government. Mr. Wyndham said that \$750,000,000 could safely be advanced on Irish land, but he thought that the scheme would not involve \$500,000,000.

Devery Is His Own Bank.

Although former Chief of Police William S. Devery is credited with having \$1,000,000, he never has been known to give a check, and it is not recorded that he ever had a bank account. All his real estate, and he has bought some valuable property in the last few years, was paid for in cash. Some time ago he settled his taxes, and he counted out to the clerk several thousand dollars in new \$100 bills. His friends say he can lay his hands on more ready cash than any man in New York except Russell Sage. He keeps most of his money in safe deposit vaults.

Preparing to Hunt the Pole.

Anthony Fiola, the head of the polar expedition to be equipped by William Ziegler of New York, is in Europe looking after some of the preliminaries of the expedition. His visit includes an inspection of the steamers America and Frithjof at Tromsø, Norway. He will soon return to New York, but will make another trip to Europe before the expedition leaves in June.

Fiola, formerly an officer in the Cuban army, and the new expedition crew are all Americans, largely recruited in Cuba and the Philippines, but all having had a wide experience in arctic navigation.

The expedition will go from Tromsø to Franz-Josef Land, whence the Frith-
