For Member of Congress First District.
HON. BINGER HERMANN.
Election day, Monday, June 1st.

SALEM AND BINGER HERMANN.
Salem, as a city, and the people of Salem have a direct personal interest in the election to congress of Hon. Binger Hermann.

It was Speaker Reed who refused to make him chairman of the rivers and harbors committee, because he would empty the national treasury.

Salem has direct and immediate need for such a man in congress, and for none other because Salem is interested in three appropriations.

The Salem Indian Training School is coming to be nearly as big an institution as the state insane asylum, in point of expense.

Salem has immediate need of an appropriation for the grading of the postoffice site, of not less than \$10,000.

Salem needs immediate action for the protection of the harbor and water front of the Willamette river, and for the improvement of the river.

For the removal of the bar, protection of the west bank, and for dredging the channel, and, possibly cutting a new channel, we need \$100,000.

These are important and needed public improvements, in which the wage-earners have a vital interest. Salem business men are vitally interested.

It may be said the rest of the Oregon delegation can look after these matters for Salem. Mr. Reames might also be able to do it.

But not so well as our own congressman, in harmony with the Republican majority already elected to congress.

Let us have our own representative to look out for us; give him a reception Wednesday night and a vote that will make him our friend.

PRESIDENT COLEMAN'S WORK.
The new president of Willamette University is an up-to-date man in that important position.

He is to be given a hearing tonight before the Greater Salem Commercial Club, at the city hall, and all friends of the University, and persons interested in upbuilding Salem should attend.

There are those who have argued that such an educational institution was of no real benefit to the city.

That impression will be dispelled by Dr. Coleman's presentation, and we hope he will make the showing strong enough.

The University can be made a great self-sustaining enterprise, although denominational schools are rarely that.

Education is a prime necessity with every family having sons and daughters growing up to maturity.

Dr. Coleman believes a Christian university can be conducted on broad business lines that will serve the largest number. He favors getting out of the rut of debt, and all other ruts.

He does not believe in shutting any one out of the heaven of good things in this world or the next, because they do not think as he does.

He is a broad man in educational work, as he is in theology, and we trust that he may impress others as he has us.

At least go out and hear what he has to say for his cause.

HERMANN AT EUGENE.

Congressman Hermann opened his campaign in Lane county Monday night and was given a very cordial reception. A report appears elsewhere.

He gave a refutation to some of the personalities that the Democratic opposition have been throwing at his head, and it was very complete in every particular.

The report is industriously circulated that he has suddenly become a millionaire out of land speculations.

These stories are always started just before election, and then afterwards dropped.

In Lane county a large Democratic following will vote for Mr. Hermann solely on the ground of his efficiency in congress.

So far no matter of record has been brought against him that affects his personal or official integrity.

A verbatim report of his speech will be placed before our readers in a few days. The people are entitled to hear the candidate's own defence against his accusers.

That he completely annihilates them is the verdict of those who hear him. He speaks at Salem Wednesday evening.

ALONG RIGHT LINES.

The hearing vouchsafed President Coleman, of Willamette University by the Greater Salem Commercial Club this evening is a hopeful sign, and no doubt it will mark the commencement of better and more cordial relations between that institution and the community at large. In the past here have been unfortunate circumstances connected with this school, such as unpopular measures, that have greatly hampered the usefulness of the institution. Some of these obstacles have been quietly buried or removed, and in the interest of Greater Salem more of this good work must be done. It is becoming apparent to our people that President Coleman is the right kind of a man for this useful work of renovation and upbuilding, and he can rest assured that in as far as he demonstrates his ability in this line will be supported, morally and financially, by our community. There should be a good attendance at the reception tendered Dr. Coleman, and that gentleman should be given every opportunity to make his case. Let there be a good turn out at the city hall this evening.

HERMANN DRAWS THE CROWDS

Well Received in all the
Southern Oregon Towns

Made a Talk Saturday in His
Opponents Home Town

Jacksonville, Or., May 12.—Hon. Binger Hermann, Republican nominee for congressman from the first district, spoke to a well-filled house Saturday night, and the closest attention was given to his speech. The Medford High School band enlivened the occasion with several selections of music before the meeting was called to order by Henry D. Kubli. Attorney W. L. Vawter, of Medford, introduced the speaker of the evening. Mr. Hermann expressed pleasure in meeting the friends and neighbors of his opponent, and discussed the principles of the Republican party. He said that the principal objection that had been raised to his being elected to this office for which he aspired was that he was not in perfect harmony with the administration, but had had some differences of opinion with the secretary of the interior in regard to the details of the management of the land office affairs. He thought that he was more in harmony with the dominant party than his competitor was.

Mr. Hermann spoke at Medford Friday evening at Applegate Saturday afternoon, and after the address of the evening went to Medford, where he took the early morning train for the north.

Pitchforked The Bull

New York, May 12.—Armed with a pitchfork, Mrs. James Morton, a plucky farmer's wife living near Flanders, N. J., for nearly an hour kept at bay a vicious bull that had attacked and nearly killed her husband. Two of the farmer's children gave the alarm, and friends and neighbors rushed to the field and drove the bull away.

While entertaining visitors Mrs. Morton became uneasy over the long absence of her husband, who had gone out to care for his stock. She heard a dehorned bull, noted for his temper, bellowing, and on rushing to the field she saw her husband lying unconscious on the ground, while the bull stood over him. Flourishing a pitchfork, the farmer's wife ran forward and drove the prongs four inches into the bull's side. As the animal still continued his attack on her husband, Mrs. Morton again and again jabbed the sharp fork into it, until the animal turned and rushed at her. With a blow on the head Mrs. Morton made the bull pause.

She was still standing guard, pitchfork in hand, when an hour later, the rescuers, summoned by the children, arrived. Mr. Morton was carried to the house, where it was found that several of his ribs were broken. He was severely injured about the head and chest.

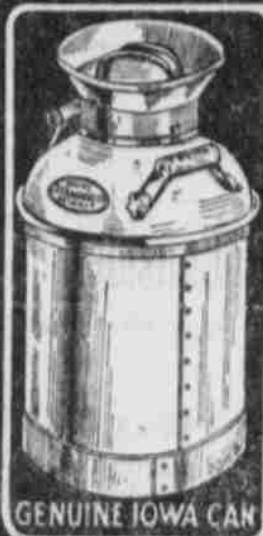
