REAMES TALKS AT LEBANON

Argument Ran Along the Old Freetrade Lines

With Enthuiasm and it is not Thought he Gained Votes

The Reams meeting, held at this place Monday night was somewhat of a frost on the tender Democratic enthusiasm, just beginning to bud. The meeting was not called to order until 8:30, by which time there was a fair sized crowd in attendance. The opening address was made by Hon, M. A. Mr. Reames spoke at some length on the tariff question, using the old free trade argument that the tariff is a tax on the consumer and is in effect a wall around the United States which keeps out prosperity.

He undertook to tell the people that ion for being the last to throw down the consumer paid the tariff and to was shipped from Oregon to the Philppines, that it must pay a duty before entering the islands and that this tariff reduced the price received by Oregon farmers for their hay. This explanation may be, satisfactory to Mr. Reames, but most of his hearers thought that it proved directly the opposite of his contention. 
