The labor leaders at Salem refused to stand for the proposition to carry on a retaliatory referendum against the Portland fair.

The Federated Trades convention, under Portland leadership, voted them down, but they made their influence felt, and it is understood the labor fight is off on that proposition, and will be dropped.

This conservative middle ground is creditable to Salem labor organizations. It will win for them the respect and confidence of all classes.

Salem should not only have no strikes, but the labor organizations would do well to promote the greatest harmony and good will with employers, contractors and capitalists.

REPUBLICAN RALLY AT JEFFERSON.

Chinese Boys Coming to America. Washington, May 15.—U. S. Consul Wilcox at Hankow, China, has notified the state department that ten bright Chinese boys of good family are to sail on the Nippon Maru today for the United States, to be placed in college.

They are in charge of Mr. Sao Ko Alfred Sae, a Washington high school boy and graduate from Cornell. The boys are relatives of Acting Viceroy Tuan, who, at the risk of his life, protected the foreigners in his jurisdiction during the Boxer uprising. The Consul bespeaks for the boys a favorable reception and treatment in recognition of the Viceroy's kindness to Americans.

French to Seek North Pole. Paris, May 15.—The Arctic expedition under the patronage of the French Academy of Science leaves France today for Spitzbergen and thence will start for Franz Joseph Land. The expedition is under the direction of Dr. Jean Charcot.

REAMES TALKS AT LEBANON

His Argument Ran Along the Old Free-trade Lines

The Crowd did Not go Wild With Enthusiasm and it is not Thought he Gained Votes

The Reames meeting, held at this place Monday night was somewhat of a frost on the tender Democratic enthusiasm, just beginning to bud. The meeting was not called to order until 8:30, by which time there was a fair sized crowd in attendance.

Hon. A. E. Reames, Democratic nominee for congress, was then introduced by S. M. Garland. Mr. Reames spoke at some length on the tariff question, using the old free trade argument that the tariff is a tax on the consumer and is in effect a wall around the United States, which keeps out prosperity.

He undertook to tell the people that the consumer paid the tariff and to illustrate his point said that when hay was shipped from Oregon to the Philippines, that it must pay a duty before entering the islands and that this tariff reduced the price received by Oregon farmers for their hay.

After he had finished the tariff and trusts he proceeded to give "the other side of the land question," which consisted of some bare statements that more than thirty years ago Hermann resigned from the land office at Roseburg before the time for which he was appointed had expired and that he also resigned from the general land office last winter.

He also told a few pretty good stories that brought out some feeble applause—a thing that had been conspicuous by its absence during the greater part of his remarks. To be fair to Mr. Reames we must say that he is a man of pleasing appearance and a good talker, although no more able a speaker than any of a half dozen of the leading Democrats of this county.
