Revolution is Captured

New Orleans, May 14.—The steamer Victoria, with all the Nicaraguan revolutionists on board, has been captured by the Nicaraguan forces. This means an end to the conflict. The Victoria was a passenger steamer, recently seized by the revolutionists and fitted out as a gunboat. Advice says a battle occurred on Lake Nicaragua, the details of which are meagre, but it is supposed the Nicaragua gunboat Ninety-Three effected the capture.
