



TO CARE FOR THE INSANE

New Law Makes Relatives Liable for Their Care at the Asylum

At the last legislature an act was passed to amend section 3621 of Bellinger and Cotton's annotated code and statutes of Oregon, relating to the pay of patients confined in the Oregon state insane asylum. Heretofore the state has stood all the expense connected with the care and treatment of patients committed to be state asylum, whether or not the person committed, or the parents, children or guardians of the person were able to

The new law, which will go into effect tomorrow, provides that it shall be the duty of the county judge, at the time any person is committed to the insane asylum to determine whether the said person, his or her parents, children or guardian, are able to pay the state for the maintenance of such person during the time he or she is an inmate of the asylum. If the county judge shall determine that such person, his or her parents, children or guardian have the ability to pay, he shall make an order to that effect, and the person or persons so designated shall pay \$10 to the state treasurer per month, on or before the first day of January and July each year.

In the case of failure to pay the amount due within 30 days after the same becomes due, it shall be the du ty of the state treasurer to furnish the prosecuting attorney a statement of the amount due, and the prosecuting attorney shall collect the amount in the same manner as other indebtedness due the state would be col-
