Richards, of the general land office, reversing the local office, and taking the ground that the entryman had not complied with the homestead law.

The land is officially described as the northeast quarter of section 20, township 9 south, range 7 east, and comprises 160 acres. On the property are the well-known Breitenbush Hot Springs, which have been visited anaually for many years by residents of the Willamette valley. 
