THE JOURNAL'S POLICY.

This is not about the Salem Journal—but the Portland paper that has wisely and felicitously appropriated its name for better or for worse—the policy of a Portland paper always being interesting.

We challenge the ingenuity of our readers to translate the flowing language employed to conceal thought that enunciates the following bit of humor, as an outline of the policy of the Portland namesake:

"Politically The Journal will array itself on the side of Democracy when national issues are at stake and the candidate of the Democracy is deserving of support. IN STATE AND CITY PERSONAL POLITICAL AFFAIRS WILL HAVE NO GUIDING HAND AT THE EDITORIAL HELM; the paper will advocate the men best fitted to serve the people, but, all moral matters being equal with candidates of political parties here, The Journal will support the Democratic nominees."

There is a beautiful undercurrent of moral suasion in the above that elevates journalism above the sordid plane, where it is sometimes kept for mercenary purposes.

The Salem Journal left the Republican party when that party abandoned its traditional bimetalism, and twice supported Bryan as the representative of a paramount principle.

The Salem Journal left the Bryan Democracy when it turned its back on the American government in the war with Spain, and the struggle to put down the insurrection in the Philippines.

The Salem Journal refused to support the machine nominee of the Republican party when it turned its back on life-long devoted men, and took up a spurious fee-grabber and ex-Democratic office-seeker.

The Salem Journal refuses to support the objectionable machine nominee of the Democratic party for congress at this special election.

The Portland Journal can steal our name, but we regret extremely that its larceny of good things does not extend to the policy of the only really independent newspaper in Oregon.

Read the above declaration of the Portland Journal carefully, and you will discover that its only aim is to steal the support of the independent public and transfer them over to the Democratic machine that it is trying to build up in this state.

SALEM SPRING TRADE.

In spite of big stocks and some very fine bargains, spring trade has been slow, but on the whole much better than last year.

People in Western Oregon do not buy their summer things until there is a real dose of specific caloric pouring down, and that is a feature slow in materializing until along in June or July.

SUMMER LAW SCHOOL.

The Oregon Law School Journal for May has made a special effort to call attention to the advantage of a summer law school at Newport, and the chances are favorable to having a large class. Dean Richardson has a novel plan, and yet one that has been adopted by Columbia and other Eastern schools.

A thorough course of lectures will be given during July and August by Dean Richardson, of the Oregon Law School, and while students can study all the text-books they like, and to advantage, the lectures will be very complete in themselves, and the plan of taking notes and then having the students write them out and submit them for correction and examination, makes a very practical and satisfactory method of getting a course in legal studies.

The occasion must make the orator. To fit the occasion the orator must speak from the heart that which he feels deeply and upon which he has great depth of conviction, or has suffered deeply.

He can only impart impressively that which he has graven and ground into his very being by experiences.

All pretended feelings are acting, mimicry, affectation. Truth must be expressed on a basis of actual belief founded on experiences.

Wendell Phillips could be a great orator because he had convictions that would and did lead him to face a mob and be stoned and rotten-eggged and killed for his convictions.

The present false system of memorizing a written speech, almost always cribbed or compiled from books, not a vestige of originality about it, is not oratory. It prevents and prohibits oratory.

Elocution is a legitimate art. Present oratory is a farce. It is high time the colleges taught what oratory really is and must be.

THE ART OF JOINING.

The art of joining lodges and labor unions is being carried to extremes by some of the prominent politicians.

President Roosevelt has been made a member of the Bricklayers' and Masons' union. He is in a position to keep Senator Hanna yelling for "mort" and bricks if he would get his share of attention.

To the credit of Hanna he said that he has not joined any unions and has not been a demagogue on the lodge proposition.

McKinley was made a member of bricklayers' union at Chicago when he went there to dedicate a government building that was constructed in a notoriously rotten and corrupt manner.

What the people want is men who will not take a little of that kind of flattery to close their eyes to bad administration.

The system of conferring degrees by universities on politicians is another abuse that is just as ridiculous.

Labor does not respect a political "jiner" and really educated men look with contempt upon the perfunctory granting of degrees by colleges.

Mark Hanna has a position as an employer of labor and he maintains that position with dignity and commands respect.

We are no enthusiast for Mark Hanna but make the contrast to illustrate the difference between a dignified position and one that savors of demagoguery.

SALEM SCHOOL TEACHERS
List of Those Who Have Been Selected for Ensuing Year

The Salem board of education held

its annual session Saturday evening to select a corps of teachers for the ensuing school year. There is always a great deal of pressure for these positions and there is necessity for making additions to the teaching force under the direction of the city superintendent and it is a disagreeable duty to perform this service, both for the board and the city superintendent. Still the work must be done and the result is made known below.

The Salem schools have made great progress the past year and the work of City Superintendent Traver meets with general commendation. In him the board and community seem to find a real leader for the public educational work and the community is to be congratulated on his engagement for another year. The principals have also gained in force and popular favor and are a strong body of teachers. Salem can be justly proud of having an exceptionally strong body of grade teachers and many of those who resigned will go to take promotions in other schools. The new teachers employed include some of the strongest educational workers in the county who have been mostly called to the attention of the board by the city superintendent while he has attended conventions in different parts of the county, for Prof. Traver is a worker and is in great demand as a normal instructor.
