ABOUT HEDGE HOGS

Comedy in Four Acts and More Still Coming

And All Because the Legislature Gave a Bounty of 25 Cents Each for Scalps

(Chicago Tribune.) A comedy in four acts with a fifth to come, in which the hedge hog is the leading motive, recently has been enacted in Maine. It signally illustrates Yankee alertness and resources in an emergency. At the last session of the legislature a bill was passed giving a bounty of 25 cents a head upon all hedgehogs killed within the several towns. As soon as the governor signed the bill it stimulated the industry of hedgehog destruction to such an extent that in one town orders were honored for the slaying of 210 of the animals. This was on April 24. Then someone discovered that the law was not operative until May 1, so that the bounty on the 210 was so much money thrown away, and the second act began. The town clerk asked the parties to refund the money but they refused, and this led up to the third act. The astute town clerk hunted up a musty law which imposes a fine of \$5 for killing hedgehogs between October 1 and June 1, and, as this law is operative until the new law goes into effect, he complained of the men who had killed the 210 hedgehogs and a local justice fined them \$5 and costs for every offense. The hunters did not relish this transaction. For each 25 cents bounty they had received they had to pay a fine of \$5 and \$4 costs, so that for each hedgehog whose forepaws and nose had been brought in they were \$8.75 out of pocket.

This is not the local idea of a bargain, even in hedgehogs. Furious over the loss of their money, the hunters began looking the laws over and found one which provides that any man who had any part of a dead hedgehog in his possession between October 1 and June 1 was liable to a fine of \$5 and costs. There could be no doubt the town clerk was liable under this law, as the noses and forepaws were in his possession, so the clerk was haled before the same justice and found guilty. The court fined him \$1,050 and added \$62 as costs. The fifth act in the hedgehog comedy will come off in the higher courts, to which the clerk has made appeal. As a business venture the situation now stands as follows: The town paid \$52.50 for the hedgehogs, and the hunters paid the town in fines and costs \$1,890, so that it is \$1,837.50 ahead. The clerk is out of pocket thus far \$1,112, and perhaps more before he gets through. The 210 hedgehogs which have caused all the fuss have lost everything. So clerk, town, people and hedgehogs have all got in to trouble for lack of a little legal carefulness. Indeed, in that particular town where the 20 bowed before the majesty of the law, troubles just now are as thick and sharp as "quills upon the fretful porcupine."

News From Oakland.

This is a pretty place in the heart of the Umpqua valley, before the railroad begins to climb the Calipoola mountains to the north. All over the hills are prune orchards, and in the bottoms are hop fields. The foothills of the mountains are growing up to beautiful second-growth forest.

Oakland is the center of a great poultry business, and stock is also shipped from here in large quantities. While campaigning in Douglas county I met Mort Savage, formerly of Salem. He is living at Yonocilla since a year, but may go to Vera Cruz, Cal., where he has a son living, who is in with the Long Gold Extracting Company that was organized in Salem last year. Mr. Savage is one of six sons who came over the plains to Oregon in 1846 with their father, Towner Savage, and settled at Salem. Like most of the immigrants, they were in limited circumstances, but have nearly all done well. They were John Savage, Sr., living at Salem; the oldest; Lewis Savage, of Salem; Alfred Savage, in California; Lyman A. Savage, deceased; Mort R. Savage, above referred to, and O. G. Savage, the youngest, in business at Salem. There were two daughters, Mrs. Hanna Holderness, now dead, and Erna Edwards, living at Walls Walla.
