CARNIVAL CATECHISM

What is a Carnival?

A Carnival is a scheme of entertainment usually given in behalf of some public or quasi-public enterprise.

Who is behind the Salem Carnival? A body of 299 Salem business men grouped in an incorporated association known as the Greater Salem Commercial Club.

What are they giving it for?

To brighten up the summer business season, by bringing thousands of people to the Capital City for pleasure and business, and to put a few thousand dollars into their treasury.

What will they do with the things and they secure for their treasury?

They will spend every dollar of it in further advancing the City of Salem, the County of Marion, and the State of Oregon; and in expediting such local enterprises as the people call for.

What will be the scope of the Salem Carnival?

It will consist of a splendid beach section, one hundred feet in width and twenty-five feet in dimensions, fronted by a beautiful entrance arch, the whole elaborately decorated and bolstered by eight immense tents, in which the menagerie, the vaudeville, the glass-blowers, the circus work and other and multifarious and interesting displays of the Oregon, Pacific & Oriental Shows of E. J. Arnold, of Portland, will be on continuous exhibition; and each and all open to the world at a minimum rate of admission. A magnificent band will be on hand day and night

to dispense the best music, and every element of comfort and personal safety and convenience will be furnished at all times.

How many strangers are expected to visit Salem?

The management has calculated upon at least 50,000, for the week.

Is the city prepared to shelter and feed this army of people?

The hotel and boarding house proprietors are authority for the assertion that ample provision will be made for all who come.

Will there be excursion rates to Salem for that week?

One and one-third fares will be furnished for the rail, river, and road lines entering Salem for the Carnival season.

What sort of specialties are to be offered during the week?

There will be splendid street parades, day and night fireworks, reception and coronation ceremonies, public weddings, baby-shows, fraternal lodge competitions, balloon ascensions, fire-brade tournaments, prize events, electrical displays, high diving and a wonderful program for the last and greatest day, Saturday, July 4th.

What will interfere with the Carnival?

Nothing short of the consumption of the show by fire or the onslaught of a flood greater than that withstood by Noah of old.

When does the Carnival begin and end?

At high noon on Monday, June 29th closing at midnight on Saturday, July 4, 1903.
