MARION OFFICIAL COUNT

Shows Some Interesting Results by Precincts

A Large Vote in the District, Everything Considered in the Case

3-Head—Marion official count

Justice of the peace H. Overton, of Woodburn, and D. A. Magness, of Champeog, and County Clerk John W. Rowland, constituting the county canvassing board, finished the canvass of the vote cast in Marion county on Monday last for congressman for the first district, showing that out of 3753 votes cast for all candidates Hermann received a total of 1764, Reames 1597, Inglo 209, and Elmore 183, and giving Hermann a plurality of 167 votes over Reames, as stated in The Journal, with three precincts estimated. Taking it all in all the victory was a good one for Mr. Hermann and his friends, and for the party and the people. It is proverbial that in off years, more especially in special elections, Republicans lose heavily, and often entirely. In the only two special elections for congressman since Oregon became a state, the Democrats won in both instances. Had this been a general election Hermann would have won by 5000 plurality, instead of by nearly 2500. It is a notable fact that Mr. Hermann's candidacy united the factions in every county but Clackamas. The result in that old Democratic stronghold, Linn, shows that the Democrats really did not want their candidate to succeed, and their abstinence from voting was a characteristic feature of the election.
