## LAYING OVER RIVALS

### American Pullets Sustain America's Prestige

#### Give Opponents "Goose Eggs," So to Speak in Every Inning

The American hen is distinguishing herself in far-away Australia. Press reports received show that the three coops of American chickens sent to Australia to compete in an international egg-laying contest, under government supervision in the Agricultural college at Sydney, are distancing their competitors of French, English, German and other nationalities.

At latest reports the production of eggs by the Americans was so far in advance of their rivals that the three coops are almost certain of taking first, second, and fourth prizes on the list.

#### Maintain State's Record.

One of the three coops is from California and is said to be upholding the state's reputation for poultry raising. Last February, in response to the challenge of Australian poultrymen for America to send three coops to take part in a "laying competition," the fanciers of this country prepared to do battle. A great number of breeders signified their willingness to send birds, but as the rules allowed three pens only the selection was made by lot. The choice fell upon W. K. Hays, Henleyville, Tehama county, Cal., white Wyandottes; Mrs. A. H. Hansel, Loup City, Neb., single comb brown Leghorns; and W. B. Candee, Fayetteville, N. Y., white Wyandottes.

#### All Competitors Distanced.

The rules called for six pullets in each pen and they were shipped from San Francisco about the middle of February in order to have a short time in which to get acclimated.

What the California hens with their sister Americans did to their rivals of less favored climes is stated in a Sydney cablegram as follows:

"So rapidly grew the pile of white eggs from the American coops when the word 'go' was given that inside of a week the other nationalities were left hopelessly in the rear."

## Burned in New York

New York, June 12.—Three children and one man were burned to death and four seriously injured in a fire of incendiary origin, which destroyed a four-story tenement on 113th street today. Four families occupied the building. The firemen found a great quantity of oil-soaked rags in the hallway.

Nearly 100 fires, in which a dozen lives have been lost, have occurred in this neighborhood since November last. The authorities believe one firebug is responsible for all. A coincidence is brought up, that this fire in the heart of Little Italy, occurs on this the feast day of St. Anthony of Padua, the patron saint of fire. Today thousands of residents of Little Italy are supplicating the saint for protection. One of those injured died in the hospital this afternoon, making the fifth victim.
