AMES WAS FROM OREGON

Had a Vice-Once Presidential Boom

Had Minneapolis Within His Grash but is Now in the Penitenti ary

Alonzo A. Ames, who has recently been convicted in Minneapolis; was several times elected mayor of Minheapolis. For years "Doc" Ames was the most popular man in the "Flour City" and nearly everybody in that section of the Northwest knew him well. He was in the "good fellow" category, the kind that belonged to all the secret societies, the life of the picnics, excursions, etc., who always attended the balls given by the policemen, the firemen, and the various national and social organizations of the city. He would "go out with the boys and help dash the red paint upon the black sky at night." A man like that has a big heart, too. Many poor devils have been assisted by Ames and many of the humblest homes in the city bless him to this day. When St. Cloud, a neighboring city seventy miles away was awept by a cyclone and left in ruins, and death and destruction were everywhere, "Doc' Ames, then mayor, was about the first relief train that reached the city. He was no longer mayor but a physician and devoted sleepless days and nights to attending the wounded and suffering.

Ames was a Democrat in those days and could be elected mayor almost every time he made a race in that Republican city. The last time he was elected it was as a Republican. In 1888 he was at the Democratic national convention in St. Louis as a candidate for vice president on the ticket with Mr. Cleveland. He did not get much farther than to have cards printed announcing his candidacy, which were freely distributed among the delegates. Very early in the convention the delegation ran up a big red bandana handkerchief that meant that Cleveland had decided upon Thurman, so all other vice presidential booms were quietly folded away.

Ames had some difficulty in getting to the convention as a delegate. by offering a resolution electing both of his candidacy for vice president.
