### Getting Ready for Match With Jeffries

### His Friends Expect Him to Surprise the Champion When They Meet

It is more than possible that when Corbett meets Jeffries in the squared circle in August he will give the big boiler-maker and the sport-loving public as well a great surprise. If careful attention to training and determination can do it Corbett will enter the ring fit to make the battle of his life. He thinks he can win, and realizing that it is his last chance to redeem himself, he proposes to make the most of his opportunity. Already he has been at work for nearly three weeks and he shows improvement. To a correspondent of the Record-Herald a few days ago Corbett spoke freely of his chances and told of his training plans. He said:

"I now weigh about 185 pounds, but expect to enter the ring at 190. I am working on a new plan. Instead of training down my training consists of building up muscles. I shall gain weight slowly but steadily from now until the fight. My road work consists of a walk at a good stiff pace for ten or twelve miles. I don't tire myself out by a long run to reduce weight and, in fact, I never break out of a good fast walk. I use the swinging rings in the open air a good deal and put in much time on the mat. I have adopted a system of physical culture exercises which is doing wonders to build muscles and increase my wind. My chest expansion has been increased four inches by following this plan. Every day I box three fast rounds each with Sam Berger and Yank Kenny. Later I shall add rowing to my list of exercises."

Corbett admits freely that he is not as fast as he was as a youngster, but declares he can hit much better than he ever could before. Yank Kenny gives convincing testimony as to the force of Corbett's blows when he shows his cut lip and damaged nose, both of which are due to them. The one-time champion is certainly devoting himself to work. He resists all attempts to induce him to spend his evenings in the city.

Jeffries has been having a good time in San Francisco and Oakland. He is in good trim, but has not yet settled down to steady training, and has not made up his mind when to begin. He figures that he has six weeks and more in which to get into shape and there is no need of hurry. His training quarters have been well chosen on the bay shore at El Campo, some ten miles from San Francisco. The place is remote from the ordinary routes of travel and presents many advantages. The admirers of the champion will either have to take a special boat to reach the training quarters or walk a couple of miles. Of course Jeffries is a top heavy favorite in the estimation of most sporting men but there is no question that Corbett has gained friends since he arrived. He is bigger and stronger than he ever was before. His knowledge of the game is just as great. His main handicap and it is a great one is his age.

### To Wash Lawns.

To give lawns, white or printed, a look of newness that nothing else can impart, take two ounces of fine gum arabic, powder it put into an earthen jar, cover and let it stand over night. ## Lynched the Negro

Chattanooga, June 30.—A mob this morning went from Larkinsville, Alabama, to Scottsboro, 40 miles away, shot down Sheriff Austin; took his keys, entered the jail and led away the negro, Diggs, who is charged with attempting to assault a white girl at Larkinsville Sunday night. The presumption is the negro was lynched or burned.  
Conductor Hawkins, of the Alabama Southern road, while the train was running this side of Larkinsville today, says he saw Diggs, the negro, who was taken from the jail here, hanging to a tree. Nothing further has been heard from the mob, which presumably dispersed quietly after the execution.

A deposit of \$200.00 in cash or certified check payable to the superintendent must accompany each bid for meat, and of \$75 for bids for flour and fish, all other bids must be accompanied by an amount equal to 10 per cent of the amount of the bid.  
The right is reserved to reject any and all bids and to accept or reject any portion of a bid.  
On each envelope should be inscribed the nature of the bid. Goods of Oregon manufacture or production will receive preference, other things being equal.  
All goods and supplies must be delivered to the Penitentiary within 20 days after the contract is awarded, unless otherwise provided in contract.

## Receiver Appointed

Newark, June 30.—Judge Kirkpatrick, of the United States circuit court, today announced that he had decided to appoint a receiver for the United States Shipbuilding Company. He will give the attorneys an opportunity to agree on a receiver, if they so desire. Demming, in behalf of the directors of the company, asked that the court grant 24 hours to the company in which to decide who it desired as receiver. This was strongly opposed by the plaintiffs. The court advised both sides to confer amicably, and try to agree on a receiver.

The court finally decided to defer the time of appointing a receiver until 11 o'clock tomorrow. It declared it wanted to avoid the naming of the man, as he had already been flooded with applications for the place. From responsible persons two names are prominently mentioned for the place. In case the contending parties fail to agree, are Former Senator Smith, of New Jersey, and Charles Stokes, of Trenton. The receivership will be one of the richest ever filed, as it involves the rehabilitation of \$70,000,000 concern, with shipyards from Maine to California.
