HITS THE HOP ORGAN

New York Dealer Makes Fun of the Fictitious Way of Booming Prices

Hugh Fox, hop dealer, New York, reports to the Western Brewer, of Chicago, as follows:

"The hop market has dwindled to a mere matter of idle talk. There is literally nothing doing, and brewers are so hopelessly indifferent that they do not even care to look at samples or discuss contracts. Evidently they have plenty of hops for summer brewing, and are well satisfied that there is no present danger of a crop shortage, which is indeed a fact. Under these circumstances it is curious to read in the organ of the Oregon Hop Growers' Association the following bold-faced scare-head: 'Plan to Break Pool. Brewers Will Attempt to Withhold Orders for Another Month.' The organizers of this wonderful pool have apparently employed a press agent to put up the market, but so far he seems to be a poor salesman, and the only result has been to block business. Even children are adept at making faces, but it seems rather a futile method of seeking business."

The Journal does not pretend to know where the organ of the hop growers' pool is published, whether at Portland or at Salem. Miners Have to Turn Back

Seattle, June 30.—A special to the Post-Intelligencer from Dawson says: The first news since March from the vast stretch of 2000 miles down the Yukon Basin, from Eagle to St. Michael and Tanana, Koyukuk and Rampart camps and Kuskowim watershed came today on the steamer Rock Island from Andreaski. The steamer has passengers from all camps mentioned, mostly from the Tanana. They report hundreds of miners at the mouth of the Tanana river with no money to pay fare up, but going down the Yukon. Four thousand people are in camp there.

Indians from the Kuskowim, who arrived at Andreaski, report the steamer Anna Wande, belonging to Lynn's Post was lost when the ice went. Damage was also done to the post.

A big strike has been made on Hog creek, in the Koyukuk, and \$5 to \$20 is being made daily to the man. The camp has 300 men, all well supplied.

Mrs. Durfee, better known as Corinne Gray, committed suicide at Rampart by shooting.

Dr. D. C. Medill, formerly of Dawson, was elected mayor of Fairbanks.

Alexander Coutts, who was shot by Recorder B. Daenckle, from Tucuma, has recovered. No prosecution.

Judge James Wickersham and party of five have left Fairbanks to join the Cooke expedition to Mount McKinley, and will return to Rampart in August.

Nugget From Mule Gulch

A nugget of gold weighing 2½ pounds, and valued at \$522, lying in the shift-

ing sands, thrown out by the hydraulic and glittering along the bedrock till it attracted the practiced glance of the miner was picked up—that is what transpired in the Mule Gulch placers of Johnson & Son last week, says the Grant County News.

This bit of early day mining intelligence was written in a letter by W. H. Johnson to his friend in this city.

Mr. Johnson said further that he was tired with his day's work and was seated on a boulder, nursing a lame back, when some one called to him to come over. He came, he saw, he was conquered, or at least his back-ache was, having entirely disappeared.

The gold is of fine quality, worth about \$240 to the pound. As the specimen weighs 2½ pounds, there can be but little quartz mixed with the precious metal.

The rich specimen was evidently broken from the ledge which crosses a gulch a few rods above the placer ground, and upon which it is understood an option is held by Robert Hines, of Canyon City.
