THE FACTION BREEDERS.

The Journal is not the adviser of the Republican party of Oregon, or it would say to the papers that are building politics on the old factional lines, stop.

The Salem report, published elsewhere, of a line-up in Marion county on the Simon and anti-Simon factional division has little foundation.

The next legislature has no senator to elect. The state senators from this county are all hold-overs. Where is there room for factions?

The Republicans will have to put up five representatives who will have no vote on United States senator. Why factionalize the party?

The business of breeding factions has been overdone in Oregon. It leads to no result but an extravagant, corrupted legislature.

The factions stand for no principle of good government, no great interest. They are for personal enterprise, not for public benefit.

Factions stand for the smallest and meanest and most expensive kind of politics, and should be abolished.

The faction revolves about one man who puts up the money and distributes the patronage.

Let us get a new movement on Oregon politics, stop breeding discord and breed a little more harmony and real results.

Marion county Republicans will show good sense and political wisdom if they refuse to be stirred in the interest of any Portland faction.

WEIGHT OF DEAD PROPERTY.

If the average citizen would examine carefully into his affairs he would find that dead property is a heavy load to carry.

It is more than likely that the greater share of property is unproductive, and but for the use the owner gets out of it, earns nothing.

Considering the taxes, repairs, the

care and interest on the money, it is likely that two-thirds of all real estate held is a load to the owner.

Many farms, in even better states than Oregon, are a source of expense to the owner, and nearly all city property consumes earnings.

Unless city real estate can be made to advance in value, and be sold at a margin, and unless other lands can be made productive, they oppress.

The owner of such property has to get money from other sources to hold onto the property, and enough such property will make him poor.

The only way to make city property worth anything is by improvements. Buildings that will rent well, streets and sewers, alone will advance it.

The weight of dead property can only be overcome by a policy that permits the whole community to go forward, that causes values to steadily increase faster than the annual fixed charges against such property. Can you grasp that idea? Then you should favor a general policy of improvement, which alone can advance the prosperity of the community.

A PORTLAND APPOINTMENT.

The Portland people cannot get enough of small things. They seem to unite in selecting the infinitesimal and foisting it on the rest of the commonwealth in the name of the Republican party.

First it was proposed to put about the smallest lawyer in that town in Governor Lord's place, as minister to the great Argentine Republic. But that wasn't small enough to suit the great influences down there.

So they hunted around and found a mere newspaper reporter and hanger-on for any old thing in the way of an official sugar-titty, and the Hon. John Barrett, of nowhere, is made minister plenipotentiary.

No one will blame the Oregon delegation for recommending such a manifest absurdity and obscurity for a \$10,000 position, because it is the unanimous sentiment of the brains and influence of Portland that speaks and demands his selection.

Our United States senators are made to believe that the whole political influence of Oregon, the whole financial honor of the state and its future development as a commonwealth hangs on this man Johnny Barrett's appointment.

Barrett is a floating import, drifting on the political tide of importunity, and individual obscurity and nonentity, foisted on an honest, industrious state of laborers and producers, by bug-house politics.

The skull-and-bones aristocracy of grafters, professional jobbers, chasadors and hanger-on politicians will prostrate themselves before the new minister to the greatest South American republic, and join in the wonderful brass-band acclamations of his discovered greatness.

How much longer shall Oregon men of character and ability be trampled in the dust for pin-head importations? So long as Portland rules the roost.

The Fatal Pistol.

Yesterday's telegraphic news from Everett set forth that a young man had died of lockjaw, after a period of intense suffering his malady and death were caused by a toy pistol. The wad had gone into his hand, as the wad from a toy pistol usually does, and the result had been the terrible death of the victim, quite the ordinary result. There is a natural feeling of sympathy for the unfortunate, but it is well to draw a lesson from his fate.

Soon the Fourth of July will be upon us. It is a time made dreadful by noise, the senseless clamor supposed to be the expression of patriotism. One of the instruments of noise is the toy pistol. It is a terrible instrument. It works a greater havoc than war. For it to wound the rash youth who uses it is common, and for the youth to recover is very uncommon indeed. If the scheme were the swelling of the mortuary list, the toy pistol would be a jewel, but this is not the idea. The toy pistol is far more fatal than the navy revolver, the English bulldog, or any other form of death-dealing hardware. To be shot by a bullet of large caliber may not be a pleasing experience, but at least, it is brief. To be shot by one of those infernal toy pistols means a long period of suffering, capped by an exit into which the human frame is tied into knots. That the sale of the toy pistol be forbidden is a reasonable suggestion. If there are too many boys a far less annoying process of getting rid of them would be to administer poison.—Tacoma Ledger.

Servia's Press Censorship.

Servia is taking a leaf out of the book of Russia in her censorship of the press. To conduct an opposition newspaper has become an offense to the Servian government. Although the liberty of the press is supposed to be guaranteed by the constitution, that liberty is caustically interpreted to mean a toleration to publish so long as nothing unpleasant to the government is put into print, with risk of confiscation if the gracious indulgence of the government be abused. The chief opposition paper, the Odjek, has been puzzled of late how to fill its columns. It has already been warned, and dares not give open expression to the faith and principles which it was founded to promulgate. The Odjek, therefore, one day having four blank columns to occupy, and having neither news nor advertisements to fill them, printed a selection of psalms from the Old Testament. This was worse than ever. The whole impression was seized by the police at the order of the censor, and the reason was given that "the nation had been
