games, and then finish the season
with Eugene, the last game being
played here. So far, to use a common
expression, Salem has been up against
the easy end.

Eugene is almost sure to beat Al-
bany Saturday and Sunday, in fact the
chances of them winning the next four
games are very good, and will bring
up their percentage column.

It does not require a very close
study of the situation to see that the
battle ground, of the next two weeks
will be where the Ragians play, and
that the two games here on Saturday
and Sunday are the beginning of the
end, for the winners will hold the key
to the situation.

The two games with the Schillers
this week have given the boys much
good practice, both in team and stick
work.

Last Saturday and Sunday Eugene
and Roseburg both won a game, and

itors.

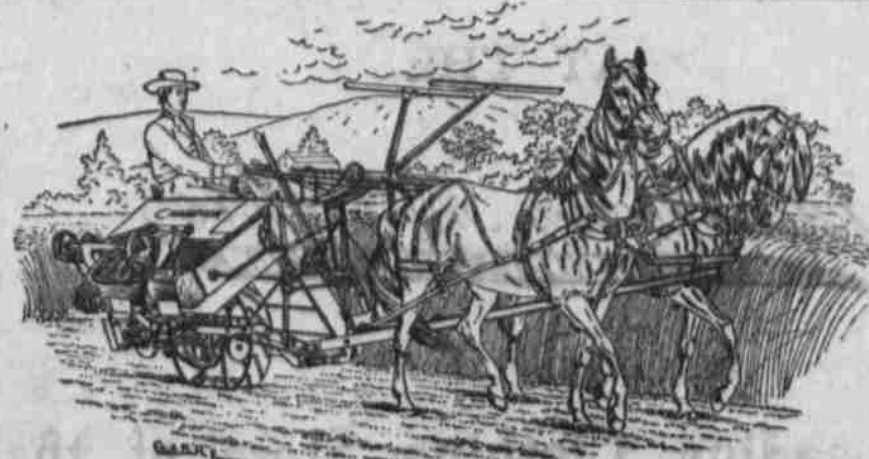

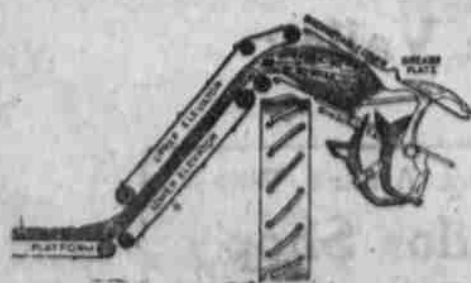
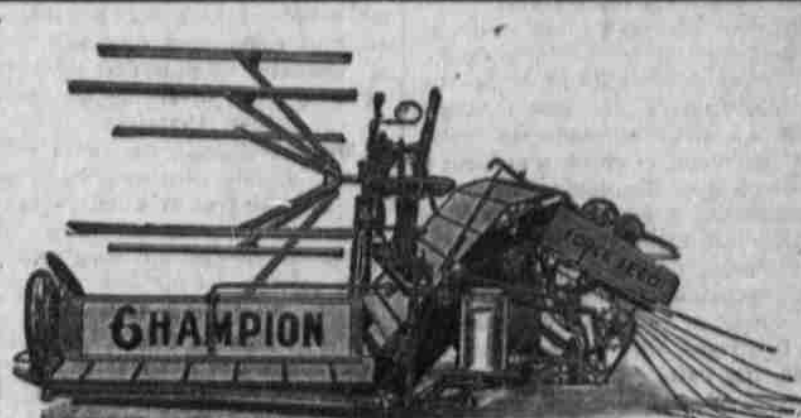
CHAMPION FORCE FEED BINDERS

LEAD THE WORLD

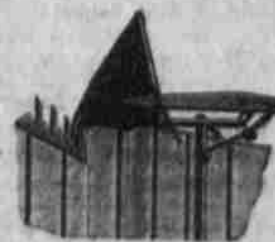
Designed especially to meet the requirements of the American farmers, the Champion force feed binder is adapted to handle all kinds and conditions of small grain, from the tallest rye to the shortest oats, and from heavy and lodged to light and crinkled wheat, and also the usual and ordinary conditions. The Champion is light in draft yet firm and strong in construction. It has a wide platform, a wide closed end elevator and steep binding deck, and is fully equipped with modern devices, many of which are found on no other machine.



The Champion force feed elevator prevents choking and waste of grain at the top of the elevator. This is accomplished by shoot-
ing the grain out from the elevator in the direction in which the
binding deck inclines, and carrying it within reach of the pack-
ing arms where it is made into bundles. The Champion has more
than the ordinary storage space back of the needle, yet the move-
ment of the grain from the elevator is so positive that it is not
delayed, which gives the machine a great advantage in difficult
conditions, such as fluffy crinkled grain, and heavy tangled grain,
and is useful in all other conditions. With the Champion eleva-
tor no grain is carried down between the elevator and binding
deck and wasted on the ground. Every spear is saved and put
in the bundle. The Champion elevator will handle light or
heavy grain equally well.



The distinguishing feature of the force feed elevator is two additional rollers at its top arranged
in a manner to deliver the grain in the right direction as it leaves the elevator. The upper belt
extends out beyond the top of the elevator, and one of these extra rollers is placed between its
plies, raising the upper ply and permitting the lower and ascending ply to deflect upward in a
curve. This curve in the upper belt changes the direction of the stream of grain, and aided by
the other extra roller at the top of the lower belt delivers the grain positively but gently to the
packing arms.



The relief rake of the Champion operating over the finger bar at its junction with the elevator prevents all accumulation of short grain, tangled grain, weeds or
grass here, and permits a full swath to be cut in all conditions of crop. The Champion relief rake is a useful device when the conditions mentioned are met, and is
no disadvantage in any other condition, because if there is not an undue accumulation at this point the rake does not touch the grain and it takes almost no pow-
er to run. The Champion elevator extends as far forward of the knife as any other elevator.
