Salem, Ore., June 6, 1903.

The board of trustees of the Oregon State Insane Asylum hereby invite sealed proposals for furnishing the following supplies to the institution for six months ending December 31, 1903: Groceries, mill feed and flour, meats and fish, dry goods, drugs, stationery, leather and findings, boots and shoes, plumbing, hardware, tinware and tinning, crockery and glassware. Lists of said supplies will be furnished by the clerk of the board upon application. Samples can be seen at the asylum, and goods must be in accordance therewith. All goods must be in strict accordance with sample in original packages when possible, and delivered at the State Insane Asylum within 20 days after contract is awarded, and bids must be on blank forms, which will be furnished, together with instructions, to bidders, by the clerk, upon application. Each bid on flour or meat must be accompanied by a certified check of \$300, and each bid on fish by a certified check of \$75, and all other bids by a certified check equal to 10 per cent of the amount bid, checks of successful bidders to be returned immediately, and those of accepted bidders when the contract is completed. Bids must be enclosed in sealed envelopes, and directed to the board of the clerk, and plainly marked "Bids for Asylum Supplies," and a class of goods bid on should also be inscribed on the envelope. Price, neatness and quality being equal, preference will be given to articles manufactured, grown or produced in the state. When a particular article is specifically called for, bids for other kind of manufacture, or brand equally as good, will be entertained but to insure recognition of such samples of the articles it is proposed to supply must accompany them. The board reserves the right to reject all or bids, or to accept or reject part of a bid. Bids will be opened at the Capitol, at Salem, at 10 a. m. Wednesday, July 8, 1903.

RIGHT EDUCATION OF WOMEN.

This problem is being beautifully promoted toward solution by the Chicago Kindergarten Institute, a school for the higher training of young women along the lines of the greater and better womanhood.

The ideal sphere for women the world over has been localized somewhere between the functions of the home-maker and the character-builder for children—possibly by a union of the two.

Child-culture and child-nurture at once satisfy the highest claims of motherhood upon the real womanhood of our country. All cannot rear children of their own from birth, but all women can rear children in the greatest sense of spiritual parenthood.

It is this high quality of mind for which the school above referred to seems to seek recognition in the struggling, strenuous young women of today.

The aims of educational life at Gertrude house are founded upon the ideals of life promulgated and put into demonstration by such great educational reformers as Froebel and Pestalozzi.

All the students from the most fashionable daughters of high social connections to the poorest girls who come are required to perform certain domestic duties every day.

House meetings, are held where the problems of homemaking are discussed, and the school seems determined to turn out real women who can do and share all that a woman should do and share. PACIFIC COAST NUMBER.

How completely the state of California monopolizes the name of the Pacific coast may be seen by a glance at the Atlantic Monthly for July, which claims to be a Pacific coast number, but is all about California.

The California poet makes a good showing for their Muse, and there is likewise a poem by Mabel Earle, a new Western poet, which is sure to attract much attention. The quality and flavor of all the contributions are significant, and it is particularly fitting that the magazine which first introduced Bret Harte's stories to Eastern readers, and which has constantly utilized the best prose and verse produced in California should, in one number, perform this interesting service.
