### Reward for Train Robbers

The repeated hold-ups and robberies in Portland, and the apparent inability of the local authorities to cope with the evil, have aroused Governor Chamberlain, and he has decided to take a hand in the matter, and this morning he issued a proclamation, offering a reward on behalf of the state for the arrest and conviction of highwaymen robbing or attempting to rob any person upon any railroad train street car, or any public or private conveyance. The text of the proclamation is as follows:

Pursuant to the power vested in me by section 2385, of Bellinger's and Cotton's Codes and Statutes of Oregon, I, Geo. E. Chamberlain, as governor of the state of Oregon, hereby offer a standing reward of \$200 for the arrest and conviction of each and every person engaged in the robbing or attempting to rob any person upon or having in charge, in whole or in part, any stage coach, wagon, railroad train, or other conveyance engaged in carrying passengers, or any private conveyance within this state. No reward will be paid, however, except after conviction.
