## Pope Leo Has Not Prepared His Burial Place

Has Only Expressed Preference as to the Final Disposition of His Body

Rome, July 17 .- The events of the last week have served to explode a number of years to the effect that he did so: Pope Leo XIII. had erected for hima magnificent tomb as his last resting place. This tomb was fre-quently described as being constructed of Carrara marble, with a lion upon the lid whose paws protect the pontifical tiara. On the right was supposed to be a statue of Faith bearing a candle and the Holy Scriptures; on the left a figure of Truth bearing the coat of arms of Leo XIII, upon a shield, and upon the pedistal the in-scription: "Hie jacet Leo XII., Ponti-fex Maximus, Pulvis est." (Here
