Small Debtors Must Pay up

Chief Clerk George G. Brown has issued a circular letter to the holders of certificates of sale of state school lands, who owe \$50 or less, urging them to pay at once, or their certificates would be cancelled. The letter is issued under an order of the board, and a copy of the order goes with each letter. It is expected that this letter will be followed by the issuance of about 450 to 500 deeds, that many certificates being affected by the order of the board. The text of the letter is as follows:

"It appearing from certificate of sale No. of which you are the holder, that there is due on the purchase price the sum of \$...., principal and interest on such amount from at per cent.

"Pursuant to an order of the board made on July 14, 1933, I am authorized and instructed to demand payment from all holders of certificates of sale on which \$50 or less of the purchase price is now due, and to request that the same be paid on or before October 1, 1933.

"Demand is therefore hereby made that on or before October 1, 1933, you pay the purchase price and interest due on certificate No. Payment must be accompanied by the certificate of sale.

"For your information I enclose a copy of the order of the board in the matter."

The copy of the board's resolution, referred to in the letter, and sent out with it is as follows:

"In the matter of the payment of purchase price now due on certificates of sale on which \$50 or less remains unpaid:

"It appearing to the board that there are a number of certificates of sale on which there is \$50 or less of the purchase price due, and complaint being made that a large amount of property evidenced by said certificates, which ought to be taxed, is thereby escaping taxation, the holders of said certificates paying only a small amount of interest thereon to the state annually, and it further appearing that a large amount of unnecessary clerical work is required to endorse and receipt for these small payments of interest, and that the record of the state land office would be improved and the work curtailed by the payment of the remainder of the purchase price now due on such certificate, it is therefore hereby

"Ordered that the clerk be and he is hereby authorized and instructed to demand payment from all holders of certificates of sale on which \$50 or less of the purchase price is now due, and that same be paid on or before October 1, 1933, and deeds issued for the lands described therein."
