County Schools

The reports of county superintendents of Linn, Polk and Union counties have been filed with State Superintendent Ackerman, for the year ending June 15th. The reports give interesting statistics, and the condition of the schools in the three counties.

In Linn county 6692 persons of school age were enumerated; 5071 enrolled in the schools; 322 teachers employed, and 823 children attended no school during the year. The county has 118 districts, 3194 voters for school purposes and 1925 library books. The cash available for school purposes was \$132,683.40, and the expenditures were \$87,964.32. Male and female teachers were paid average monthly salaries of \$41 and \$34, respectively.

Polk county's enumeration is 3408, and an enrollment of 2474. Only 86 teachers were employed, as against 149 last year, male teachers averaging \$45 per month, and female \$35; the average daily attendance is given as \$1600, and the number of legal voters 2209; there are 65 school houses in the county and 3481 library books in the school libraries. The cash available was \$46,652.78, and expenditures \$39,225.76.

Union county's report shows an enumeration of 5419, and an attendance of 4173, with an average daily attendance of 2363. There were 121 teachers employed, at average monthly salaries of \$50.30 for males, and \$39.51 for females. The county has 61 school districts, with 2553 library books; in the county are 2506 legal voters. The money available was \$73,747.89, of which sum \$52,440.17 was expended.

There is a recorded decrease in the attendance and the number of teachers employed, as shown by this year's reports, when compared of those of last year, but this does not call for hysterics, when it is remembered that the reports filed a year ago covered the time from March 6, 1901, to June 15, 1902, a period of 15 months and 10 days, and taking in an extra spring term of school, in many districts, with extra enrollment, and employment of teachers. All the schools were running this past year, and there was no actual decrease, though the reports would indicate one.

Portage Railroad

The portage railway commission will meet at the capitol tomorrow, when Chief Engineer A. E. Hammond will make his report on the preliminary examination and survey of the proposed road, and estimates as to the cost of the line. The engineer has already reported estimates, indicating that the road can be built within the \$165,000. The board, consisting of the governor, secretary of state and state treasurer, will immediately, upon the filing of the reports, push the operations, and a permanent survey will be taken to secure the right-of-way, and invite bids for the construction of the roadway.
