Section 7. It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons, to ride a bicycle or tandem-wheel upon any sidewalk of the city of Salem, Oregon, without having said bicycle, or wheel, in firm and regular control by proper grip upon the handle bars thereof.
Section 8. It is hereby made unlaw

ful for any person or persons to stand or lodge a bicycle, a tandem-wheel, a motorcycle or a go-cart against the front of any store or business house or public building, or against the show window of any such store, house or building within the city of Salem, Oregon, nor lodge any such cycle, wheel or cart within the public entrance, hall way or stairway of such store, house or building in said city, as aforesaid. And all racks placed upon the side walks of the city of Salem, Oregon, for the use and convenience of riders of bicycles or tandem-wheels must placed upon the outer edge of the sidewalk and shall not occupy more than two feet of sidewalk space, measuring from the outer edge of said sidewalk. and all racks now in use and service in this city shall be made to conform o the dimensions herein prescribed
