**New Program At Shield's**

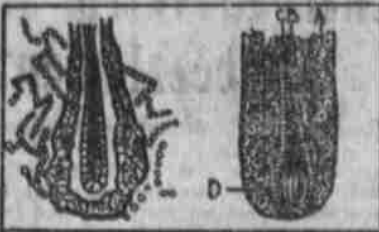

**Adjutant General**

Governor Chamberlain last evening telephoned from Portland that he had appointed Captain W. E. Finzer, of Woodburn, to the office of adjutant-general of the Oregon National Guard, to succeed Col. C. U. Gantenbein, who resigned his position yesterday, to take effect September 1st. Captain Finzer is a native of Ohio, and will be 34 years old on September 25th, next. He came to Oregon in 1889, locating at Hubbard. Later he removed to Woodburn, where he engaged in the mercantile business, and in 1891 was appointed postmaster of Woodburn, holding that position for six years. Soon after leaving the postoffice, and while engaged in merchandising, the war broke out, and he went to the Philippines as first lieutenant of Company M, Second Oregon Volunteers. He returned from the Orient with his regiment, and again engaged in merchandising in Woodburn.

Captain Finzer helped to organize the first military organization in Woodburn, when Company H, Second Regiment, O. N. G., came into existence, and he was elected first lieutenant. When that company was merged into Company M, of the Second Oregon, he went with it, and retained his rank, and made the campaign in the Philippines. After his return and retirement to private life, he was elected captain of Company D, of the Fourth Regiment, O. N. G., which position he still holds.
