Ericsson's Statue

New York, August 1.—The new statue of John Ericsson in Battery Park was unveiled today with interesting ceremonies. The unveiling was preceded by a mammoth parade of the Swedish societies of New York, Long Island and New Jersey. A corps of naval veterans and several detachments from the United States marine corps also participated in the parade. Arriving at Battery Park, Mayor Low delivered the address of welcome, and the statue was unveiled by Miss Rachel Hartley, daughter of Jonathan Scott Hartley, designer of the statue. The new statue replaces the old one of the great Swedish inventor, which has occupied a position in Battery Park near the emigrant office for the past ten years. The new statue stands nearer the center of the park and in a more conspicuous position.

A Foregone Conclusion

New York, Aug. 1.—Northern Securities advanced four points, to 33 1/4, and reacted to 30. Forty thousand shares changed hands.

Chicago, Aug. 1.—A decision was handed down this morning in the case of the State of Minnesota against the Northern Securities merger, by which the roads gain the suit.

Hill's victory is substantial. By the decision filed this morning by Judge Wm. Leeson, of the United States circuit court, the state loses on every point it made against the merger. The decision is a sweeping victory for the owners of securities.

The Great Northern and Northern Pacific stocks, the court holds the evidence fails to show the Securities Company was formed for the purpose of holding a majority of the Great Northern, as well as Northern Pacific, stock. The anti-trust act is practically a copy of the Sherman act, and related only to railroads, and the Securities Company is not a railroad. Neither road was a party to forming the Securities Company. Leeson says the Securities Company is but an investing of stockholders in the railroads without the power to consolidate them, or interfere with their management or control. This is my judgment, and it leads me to the conclusion that none of the defendants have violated the Minnesota anti-trust act. The conclusion is apparently contrary to the case of the United States Northern Securities; but the rights of litigants and my own sense of duty alike require this decision. A decree is, therefore, entered dismissing the state's bill of complaint.

St. Louis, Mo., August 1.—The active campaign of Circuit Attorney Joseph W. Folk, who has attained national prominence by his prosecution of alleged bootleggers, for the democratic nomination for governor of Missouri, begins at New Florence, Montgomery county, where he is scheduled to address an Old Settlers' reunion. Former Governor Lou V. Stephens has taken charge of Mr. Folk's campaign and has arranged to have the circuit attorney speak in the chief cities and towns of northern Missouri during the next few weeks. Later the campaign south of the Missouri river will be taken up, and Mr. Folk will be heard at Sedalia, Carthage, Springfield and other points. The managers of the Folk campaign express themselves as well pleased with the outlook and especially in regard to the friendly attitude adopted by the democratic press of the state.

Afraid of the Convicts

Placerville, Cal., Aug. 1.—Inhabitants in the state are in a frenzy of fear that the removal of the prison will permit the convicts to hold up and rob, as it is known the felons are short of provisions. The convict shot at last night was making his way toward Lake Tahoe.

Treasure From Nome

Seattle, Wash., Aug. 1.—The steamer Roanoke arrived from Nome this morning with \$350,000 treasure. The passengers report the season as very cold in the north.

Getting Ready For New Pope

Rome, Aug. 1.—Early this morning fully 2000 gathered under the shades on the colonnade of St. Peter's and watched the stovepipe protruding from the roof of the Sistine chapel. Exactly at 11:10 a puff of yellow smoke issued from the pipe. The crowd was disappointed, as the pipe leads to a small stove where the conclave is in progress. When an unsuccessful vote is taken the ballots are thrown in the stove and consumed, wet straw being used. Two ballots were taken today. The absence of smoke would be taken as an indication that a pope had been chosen. Workmen today began removing the framework from the windows over the portico from which the new pope will bless the people.

London, Aug. 1.—The Exchange Telegraph's Rome correspondent wires that two cardinals were too ill to leave their cells to participate in this morning's voting, and appointed cardinals proxies, who carried their votes to the Sistine chapel. A Rome correspondent of the Central News says on the first ballot Rampolla received the greatest number of votes, followed by Vanatelli, Oreglia, Gotti and Gibbons, who received two votes. At 6:10 smoke again issued from the Vatican stovepipe, indicating that there was no election of pope on the second ballot.

Russia Has Manchuria

Berlin, Aug. 1.—The Cologne Gazette today reports that Russia has a tight grip on Manchuria, and has ordered all foreigners to remain out of the country at present.

The Gazette adds at the end of six years, when Russia will have restored order in Manchuria, the country will be opened free to commerce. Russia has formally notified China of this order.

St. Petersburg, Aug. 1.—That Russia is preparing to meet any trouble regarding Korea, is manifested today, when it is announced the two biggest battleships, two cruisers and four torpedo boats have been ordered to proceed immediately to the far East.

Birthday of Emperor

London, August 1.—An interesting account has reached London of the recent visit of the Chinese emperor and the empress dowager to the imperial tombs, where the unhappy monarch, who, it may be mentioned in passing, will reach his thirty-first birthday tomorrow, selected the tomb in which he is to lie when his time comes. The correspondent describes the emperor as looking thin and sad and very shy, while the empress, while she is well along in the seventies, appeared full of life and energy.

The correspondent adds: "If the native reports be true, there are times when the emperor can speak to the point, simper though he is supposed to be. On reaching the palace of Pao Tingfu, which had been lavishly fitted up absolutely regardless of expense, the emperor called Yuan Shi Kai to his apartments and pointed out that he desired in his travels to see the condition of the people and learn their needs, so that imposing royal pageants were unnecessary."

Mitchell Takes Vacation.

Indianapolis, Aug. 1.—Mitchell started today for a month's vacation, the first he has had since he went to work as a breaker boy, over 20 years ago. He will remain at home with his family.
