# Naturalization

Governor Chamberlain cipt of a letter from F. B. cretary of state, at Washing ton, D. C., calling attention to the act of congress passed recently for the purpose of suppressing anarchy, preventing allens of anarchistic tenden-cles from becoming citizens of the United States, and asks the governor to call the attention of the courts of Oregon to the provisions regarding the naturalization of foreigners, a copy of the act being enclosed. The letter

"I have the honor to call your attention to the enclosed copy of the act of congress approved March 3d, to regulate the immigration of allens into the United States, the thirty-ninth section of which, taking effect July 3, 1903, provides that in order to render a court judgment of unturalization valid the court record must show that the person naturalized is not opposed all organized government, or affil ated with any organization so opanlawful assaulting or killing of of fleers of government, and has not vic lated any of the provisions of the said aliens, and has complied with the act to regulate the immigration of allons, and has complied with the terms of the previous acts on the sub ject of naturalization. The act requires also that every certificate of entrements of the above act, and pre-vious acts have been complied with, or be full and void.

Assistant Attorney-General Parker has rendered an opinion in response to the request of Supt J. H. Acker man regarding changes is boundaries of joint school districts, hosting that one county can change the boundaries of its own part of the district without awaiting the approval of the acthorities of the other county. The case in question comes up from Sherman and Gilliam counties, where the boundary board of Gilliam county has Assistant Attorney-General Parker

organized a district out of its portion of a joint district, leaving the por tion in the other county unattached.
