CHINA SEEKS TROUBLE

Another Boxer Uprising is Both Possible and Probable

There is Much Feeling Against Russia and Many Russian Officials Have Been Murdered

Manchester, Eng., Aug. 7.—A dispatch this morning says several letters have been received by officials in London, from different parts of China, predicting another serious outbreak of Boxers. Advice from the interior of China state there is much feeling against Russia, and many Russian officials have been murdered. A dispatch says Russia thinks the situation at the present time too critical to permit of reprisals, and, therefore, the news of the deaths are not given to the outside world.
