PRUNE CROP GOOD

President E. L. Smith
Estimates Yield At
30,000 Pounds

An Oregon Product That
Goes to All Parts of
the Civilized
World

Oregon prune growers will do well
this year as the crop is large and
prices bid fair to be good according

to President Smith, of the state board
of horticulture.

"I look for fully 30,000,000 pounds of
dried prunes as Oregon's output this
fall," he said today, "and the short-
age in the Eastern states and Europe
will cause good prices to prevail. The
Oregon prune reaches out farther in-
to the world's markets every year,
and this season they will be sent to
Eastern Canada, where a good de-
mand prevails."

He thinks that prune raising will
prove a profitable industry one year
with another, where the grower has a
large orchard and has good facilities
for handling the fruit. By a large or-
chard he means 40 acres and upward.
He does not consider a 10-acre prune
orchard large enough to justify the
grower in making prune growing a
business.

Mr. Smith, however, is not engaged
in prune growing himself, but devotes
his time to apple raising in the Hood
River district. He predicts a contin-
ued prosperity for Hood River or-
chardists this year, as the Hood River

apple has now a name abroad, and
the apple crop of the East is nearly a
failure. "Hood River has enjoyed un-
interrupted prosperity for the past 10
years," he said, "and there is every
indication of its continuance. Fully
60 per cent more strawberries were
planted this year than last, and the
berry exportations will increase as
time wears on. We find that the Clark
Seedling is just the strawberry for
Hood River as it is of excellent flavor,
uniform size, shape and color, and
bears shipping better than any other
species. Hood River strawberries do
not find their way into Portland to
any extent, as they are too high-
priced. Most of our berries go East.

BORN IN THE WOODS

A Pretty Wisconsin
Girl, Is Now Em-
press of Corea

The Wolverine Formerly
Known As Emily Brown,
Now Empress On, "The
Dawn of Morning"

Appleton, Wis., Aug. 8.—Born in the
backwoods as the daughter of an itin-
erant missionary and at forty the em-
press of an Oriental kingdom and
mother of the heir apparent to the Ko-
rean throne, is the story of Emily
Brown, born in Appleton, and now the
Empress Om, of Corea. The story in
its barest details comes from Tokio,
Japan, by cable to Appleton; and, am-
plified by the recollections of old resi-
dents of Appleton, is as follows:

Last January, Yi Hong, Emperor of
Corea, celebrated the fortieth anniver-
sary of his coming to the throne, and
on the same day a beautiful American
woman named Emily Brown, daughter
of a former Appleton missionary and
long the light of the emperor's harem,
was crowned Empress of Corea and
her son proclaimed heir to the throne.

Emily Brown is the first American
woman to become a real empress, al-
though Emma Hensler, also an Amer-
ican, was the wife of the King of Por-
tugal. Up to the time of her corona-
tion the new Empress of Corea bore
merely the title of Lady Emily, or
"Emay" in Korean. She is now the
Empress Om, which, translated into
English, means "The Dawn of the
Morning."

izens and church people remember the
Rev. Hobart Brown, an itinerant Pres-
byterian missionary, who many years
ago made his home in Appleton for a
few months. With him was his wife,
distinctly remembered by those who
know her as a strikingly handsome
woman, and here was born to them a
daughter who was christened Emily.
The Rev. Mr. Brown was not perma-
nently stationed here and had no regu-
lar charge; moreover, the Presbyteri-
ans had at that time no independent
church organization here, being affil-

ated with the Congregationalists. For
this reason there is no official records
of his labors here, and the exact date
of the few months' sojourn of himself
and wife and baby here cannot be ac-
curately fixed. However, it was in the
late fifties or early sixties and is per-
fectly remembered by a number of Ap-
pleton's early settlers.
