Going After Mollalla Gold

Oregon City, Or., Aug. 8.—Attracted by the reports of the fabulous deposits of gold in the Mollalla hills, in the southern part of the county, a company of Oregon City people leave tomorrow for the mining section. C. W. Kelly, John Henth, George Case and Frank Welsh are among those who expect to prospect the promising lands. The party will go by pack horses, and will thoroughly investigate the claims that are alleged to be so rich in mineral wealth.

Excitement, locally, over the rich discovery that was made on the Mollalla river is intense, and has not been equalled in the history of the county. Owners of the principal claims on which the rich deposits are found are planning for the development of their properties. It is the general belief that pending investigations will substantiate the claims that gold in paying quantities exists in Clackamas county, and that the location of the hidden wealth has been exposed.

Their Chance Will Go By

New York, Aug. 8.—Advice received here from a prominent member of congress in Bogota, state, according to the Herald's representative at Colon, that Secretary Hay, early in July, laconically cabled the United States minister, Mr. Beaupre, telling him to inform the Colombian government of the probable action of the next American congress, if the canal treaty is not ratified.

The reading of the communication from Secretary Hay, in secret session of the senate, caused vehement protests, they being considered an indirect threat of retaliation, in case the treaty failed.

Considerable excitement is said to have ensued, the principal critic and agitator being Senator Perez Soto, of Boyaca, a bitter enemy of the canal. He went so far as to say that Colombia would fight rather than "be humiliated."

Other advices from Bogota, received at Colon, say the outlook for the ratification of the treaty is more favorable.

Will Make Reservoir

Walla Walla, Wash., Aug. 8.—Government engineers, who have spent considerable time along the south fork of the Walla Walla river during the past three months, have guardedly admitted that a stupendous scheme is being considered for storing the water of the stream, to be used for irrigation purposes, says the Statesman. The scheme, as it is now under consideration, is for the construction of a huge dam across the canyon at the Reddin place, backing the water into the mountains for a distance of five miles, and pipe it from the level across the range of high hills to the valley below.

It is estimated by the engineers that a section of country embracing the Walla Walla sand belt, 30 miles long by nearly as many wide, could be watered at slight cost, the largest item of expense being the construction of the dam.
