Forrester's to Change Rates

Dubuque, Ia., Aug. 11.—Fifteen thousand is a conservative estimate of the number of delegates and visitors here for the international convention of the Catholic Order of Foresters. The record-breaking attendance is due in a large measure to the number of important questions to be disposed of by the convention.

The principal question to be considered is the old one of rates. At the last international convention, which was held in Milwaukee two years ago, a committee was appointed to take this subject under consideration and make a thorough investigation. They have been engaged upon this task since and have prepared an exhaustive report. The report says in substance that the rates are inadequate and that if it is desired to perpetuate the order an increase is imperative. The committee will present several plans for increasing the rates, one of which will doubtless be adopted.

The question of admitting liquor dealers and saloon keepers also will be brought up again. The matter was argued at length two years ago, but final decision was postponed until this year. It is thought by some that this class will be admitted, but at an increased schedule and in a separate class. The Iowa state convention voted to exclude the saloon keepers, but it is uncertain how the delegates will vote, as there are varying views among the states.

The business sessions were preceded by the celebration of high mass at the cathedral. This afternoon the delegates assembled in St. Mary's Casino and were formally welcomed by Mayor Berg. The business sessions will be commenced this evening and continued through tomorrow. A spirited contest is on for the office of high treasurer, the rival candidates being two Iowans—James A. Hayes of Dubuque and John A. Limback of Cedar Rapids.

Thursday morning the biennial parade will be held. The visiting delegates and their friends will take part, together with the local courts and many from nearby towns. Thursday afternoon the visitors will be treated to an excursion on the river. That evening and Friday will be devoted to business, and it is hoped to conclude everything by Saturday.

Plenty of Red Shirts

Lafayette, Pa., Aug. 11.—Lafayette is in gala attire in honor of the members of the Western Pennsylvania Firemen's association, whose annual convention and tournament is in progress here. More than 500 delegates are present, and in the big parade, which will be held tomorrow, there will be nearly 4000 men in line, including 3000 firemen. Greensburg, Johnstown, Jeannette and Irwin are among the cities well represented.
