## NEGRO EDUCATION IN GEORGIA.

The house of representatives of the Georgia legislature, after a heated debate, killed, by an overwhelming vote, the resolution providing that in the distribution of money to common schools the county authorities should appropriate the money among schools for white and colored youths, according to the taxable property of the two races. The debate and the vote showed that the sentiment of the Georgia legislature is that the state should contribute to the limit of its ability to the common school education of the colored youth, even when the burden falls almost entirely upon white taxpayers.

## FOURTH OF JULY FATALITIES.

According to a canvass by the Chicago "Tribune," there were 52 persons killed on the Fourth of July and 2445 injured, as a result of celebrations. These figures are doubtless incomplete, as there were 41 deaths in the state of Pennsylvania alone. Last year there 31 killed and 2172 injured. These cases are, of course, only of sufficient severity to attract public notice in the press. In addition to these there must have been thousands which were not reported. Perhaps the greater number of deaths resulted from lockjaw caused from wounds in the head. According to the canvass 550 persons were injured by pistols, and doubtless the most of them died; bombs and other kinds of fireworks injured 768 persons and fireworks, handled carelessly, injured 562; sky rockets caused 206 injuries, common 315, and runaways 81. While "fireworks" unclassified, brought disaster to no less than 1170. There have been a number of historic battles in which the number of casualties was not as great as that charged up against every celebration of Independence Day in this country, though, in the case of those battles the combatants shot to disable and kill.

## Fraternal Congress

Milwaukee, Aug. 25.—The National Fraternal congress, representing 60 fraternal insurance organizations, doing business in all parts of the country, met in seventeenth annual session in this city today with a good attendance of delegates. The annual reports of President Joseph A. Longfellow of Pittsburgh; Secretary M. W. Sackett of Meadville, Pa., and of various other officers and committees show that since the last session of the congress much substantial progress for the fraternal beneficiary system has been made. Several insurance departments have announced that the examination of the departments of the home state would be accepted by them; legislation, exempting the reserve fund of fraternal orders from taxation has

been secured in three states, proposed laws detrimental to the interests of the fraternal companies have been defeated, and progress along many other lines has been made.

## Fusionists Dont Fuse

Lincoln, Neb., Aug. 25.—For the first time in six years Nebraska Democrats are today holding their state conventions in different towns, the Democrats at Columbus, and the Populists at Grand Island. Former Governor Fyler and several other Populist leaders have recently declared in favor of breaking with the Democrats altogether, but the majority sentiment is somewhat averse to this and something of a compromise arrangement has been effected. Though meeting separately the two conventions will unite on the re-nomination of Judge J. J. Sullivan for the supreme court bench, though separate candidates may be named for regents of the state university, the minor places, on the state ticket to be voted for this fall. The Kansas City and Omaha platforms will be reaffirmed.
