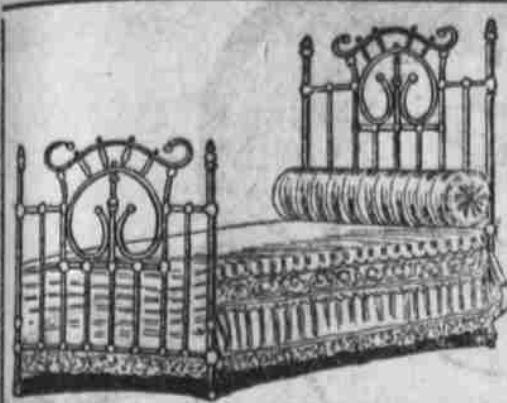

OGDEN WATER CONGRESS

Wants to Hear From Governor of a Damp Region

Prizes for Exhibits of Fruits, Hops, Barley and Other Oregon Productions

Governor Chamberlain is in receipt of a letter from Hon. Fred J. Kiesel, chairman of the executive committee of the National Irrigation Congress, which meets in Ogden, Utah, September 15 to 16, and which promises to be the most important event of the convention held by that body since its organization 11 years ago. The letter urges the Governor to attend the sessions of the congress, and calls attention to the splendid prizes to be awarded for exhibitions of fruits, hops and products of the semi-arid sections of the West, and asks for the help of and suggestions from Oregon's executive in the work of the congress. The letter is as follows:

"Ogden, Utah, August 24, 1903, Hon. Geo. E. Chamberlain, Salem, Oregon. My Dear Mr. Chamberlain: I sincerely hope that you may favor us with your presence at the Eleventh National Irrigation Congress. It will be a great congress; great in the history of irrigation and in the history of the West. I know that you are a very busy man, but I want to urge you to attend this congress. We need your help and your suggestions and earnestly urge you to be here. We have a carload of newspaper men President will be represented by his coming here from Washington; the secretary of agriculture at this congress; the St. Louis World's Fair is sending its chief of forestry and of agriculture, and we want a good delegation from Oregon.

"Do you know that we are offering a magnificent \$500 prize loving cup, made especially for this occasion, through the generosity of the Anheuser-Busch Brewing association, for the best display of hops shown at this congress? For the first time in the history of America, we will here exhibit the agricultural and horticultural products of the semi-arid region, and we have four of these magnificent \$500 prize loving cups; one for the best exhibit of hops, as mentioned above; one for the best showing of barley; one for the finest display of varied fresh fruits, and one for the best showing of sugar beets, with highest percentage of sugar.

"I am sending you under separate cover, a photograph of the Senator Clark prize, which is to be awarded for the finest display of fruit, and represents the goddess Pomona distributing the kindly fruits of the earth. It is 23 inches in height and weighs 270 ounces of silver, and is especially designated for this national congress.

"Nothing could give me greater pleasure I assure you, Governor Chamberlain, than to hear that you could lend your presence to this congress. Please wire me at once if you think you can come, and I trust you will do all in your power to have the great state of Oregon properly represented at this national convention.

"Mr. A. L. Craig, general passenger agent of the O. R. & N. company, advises us today his company will collect and exhibit here a splendid display of Oregon fruits, which is splendid news, indeed. Very sincerely yours, FRED J. KIESEL, Chairman Executive Committee."
