## Many Topics Discussed

Houston, Texas, Sept. 18.—There was an increased attendance this morning when the annual convention of the Texas Real Estate and Industrial Association resumed its sessions. Some of the numerous topics discussed during the day were as follows: Irrigation and drainage; benefits of experimental stations; legislative reforms needed for the development of Texas; dairy interests; truck farming; importance of land owners, land agents, and railroads working in harmony; public schools and the educational system of Texas; horticultural development of Texas; Texas harbors; climate, water and soils of the state; oil interests, and livestock interests. The participants in the reading of papers and the discussions that followed included business and professional men, educators, capitalists and others from every section of the state.

## Manitoba Field Trials

Carman, Man., Sept. 18.—The 17th annual field trial of the Manitoba Field Trials club began under favorable auspices today on the preserves near this place. Many dogs, the product of years of careful breeding and training, are entered in the various events that make up the program. Some of the best kennels in America are entered. The entries for the Derby alone number 62 dogs and judging from the outlook the event will be one of the most successful of its kind ever pulled off in the Dominion.

## Bank Clerks Federation

Cleveland, O., Sept. 18.—The convention of the American Institute of Bank Clerks, which began in Cleveland today, is the first national meeting of its kind to be held. The establishment of a permanent federation is the principal work of the convention, and it is probable that hereafter a convention will be held every year. The institute starts with a membership of about 6000 bank employees scattered throughout the entire country.

## The Friends Meeting

Plainfield, Ind., Sept. 18.—This was the first day of the annual meeting of the Friends church here. Delegates from fifteen quarterly meetings in Western Indiana and Eastern Illinois are present, representing a membership exceeding 15,000. The meeting has to do with the legislative affairs of the church and numerous matters will be brought up and disposed of during the present session, which will last a week.

Baltimore, Sept. 18.—Cardinal Gibbons, who sailed from Hays last week, is expected to reach home in a day or two. Preparations are being made by the Catholic Benevolent Legion, of which the cardinal was one of the founders, and by other Catholic societies in Baltimore to give His Eminence a public reception upon his arrival in Baltimore.
