THE HOP MARKET EXCITED

Bohemian Buyers Picking up the German Product

Late Returns From the Different European Supply Crops and American Estimates

Albert Ring, New York representative of the Bernhard Ring hop houses of German and Bohemia, writes The Journal, under date of September 13th, as follows:

The German Market.

"Germany reports a highly excited market, with rising tendency, influenced by Bohemian dealers purchasing in Germany. Prices for our choice grades Spats are 200 marks first grade per cwt. Exports 160 marks per cwt."

A German Letter.

A German letter from the Ring house, in Bavaria, is translated as follows:

"My last report was dated August 13th, and contained detailed estimates based on reports of the incoming harvest, and I am in a position today to verify fully the expectations then set forth.

"The weather for the past 10 days has been favorable, and the harvest of early hops all over Germany has been well begun. It is pretty well established that the yields will be as follows:

- "Bavaria, 270,000 to 275,000 cwt.
 - "Württemberg, 70,000 cwt.
 - "Saxony, 60,000 cwt.
 - "Silesia, 75,000 cwt.
 - "Prussia, 60,000 cwt.
- "The total harvest of Germany can be set down at from 470,000 to 480,000 cwt.

"It is to be considered that as picking will last three or four weeks, the quality and color of the later pickings will depend on the amount of dry weather we have.

"The crops of other countries are not so large within my estimates of August 13th: Austria, 20,000 cwt.; England, 40,000 cwt.; America, 40,000 to 45,000 cwt. It remains under all the circumstances that the world demand will be fully met by the crop of 1903.

"While last week in many quarters high prices were still expected, and efforts were made in Bohemia to boom prices all over the world, we have now entered upon a period of more quiet conditions. While high prices continue to be demanded for the short crop of Spat hops of Bohemia, we have really expected nothing more than medium prices. The quiet condition of the market is shown by the fact that prices for excellent pickings are already dropping.

"There was a local sale today of about 500 bales, many of the hops picked very early and poorly dried. Of these 200 bales, 250 bales were strictly at prices from 100 to 120 marks per cwt. Prime Humberger, represented by single bales, and prime Teutinger will run from 160 to 170 marks.

"Prices will become well-defined in the course of the next two or three weeks. General purchases will not begin before September 15-20, as the hop trade will develop slowly. One thing may be set down as a fact about the German crop: Humberger and Spat will this year yield the choicest hops."

CROOK COUNTY MURDER

Body Buried and Fire Built Over the Grave

Murdered Man's Son Suspects Foul Play and Discovers Father's Body Under the Ashes

Prineville, Or., Sept. 18.—The sheriff, accompanied by the district attorney and county doctor, has returned from the murder of S. P. Dunkel, at the Pelton place, on the Deschutes river. The coroner's jury uncovered the body from the grave dug by the murderers, about three feet deep, and brought the body to the surface.

On examination it was found Dunkel had been shot in the head from behind the left ear, the bullet from a pistol used ranged a little down and to the front near the left eye. After further investigation, and in questioning all the witnesses present the jury found Dunkel came to his death by a pistol shot in the head made by some person or persons at present unknown.

Close examination around the grave showed quite a large fire had been built over the grave. The bed of the dead man's son was also found to be in the fire, his money was gone, but his watch was on his person.

Big Meadows is 70 miles southwest of here. Mystery surrounds the case. From the meagre detail now obtainable, Dunkel and his son were encamped on the banks of the Deschutes river, and were engaged in putting up hay on the James Pelton ranch. The son left ten days ago on a cattle round-up, and when he returned Monday learned that his father had disappeared. Suspecting foul play he started a search, but no trace of the missing man could be found for some time.

Finally the son found where the search had apparently been disturbed and a fire built over the mound to divert attention. Digging down several feet at this point a boot was uncovered, and it was found to be the boot of the missing man.

The son at once rode to Prineville to notify the coroner and sheriff before removing the body from the ground. The officers left at once, accompanied by the district attorney, and they will make a thorough investigation of the case before returning.
