The Contract Let.
The Marion county commissioners' court met this afternoon in special session for the purpose of receiving and opening bids for the construction of a bridge across Pudding river, near Mt. Angel, on the road recently opened up from Howell Prairie to Mt. Angel, and which will be the most direct between that point and this city. The new bridge will be a Howe truss, the main span 104 feet long; the west approach 96 feet long, and the east approach 224 feet. In addition to the bridges and approach, there will be 700 yards of gravel fill to be made at the ends of the approaches. Bids were opened for this bridge at the July term of the county court, and they were all too high and were rejected. At that time the firm securing the contract today had the lowest bid be-
