CIGAR MEN ARE INDICTED.

Accused of Selling Brands Under Counterfeit Labels.

Lancaster, Pa .- S. R. Ross, manufacturer of cigars in Lancaster, and his factory manager, H. S. Ryder, have been indicted by the grand jury (two indictments being found against each) for manufacturing and selling cigars under counterfeit labels and trade marks all of the brands being debrated and used by owners of im sorted Havana goods.

One of the brands was "Manue Garcia" and one was "La Caroline," both of which are the property of the Havana Commercial Company. Another was "Henry Clay," belonging to the Henry Clay and Bock & Cempany, day and night.

The Militia of the United States.

The present strength of the organized militia fs about 109,000 enlisted city, men and 9000 officers.
