

SOME SCHOOL LAWS

How Money May Be Changed to Another District

Directors of District Must Transmit Child's Proportion to New District

Attorney-General Crawford yesterday rendered an opinion on the matter of the transfer of school money from one district to another, where a child enumerated in one district removes to another. The request for a construction of the law came from State Superintendent Ackerman, and the opinion he received is as follows:

"In reply to yours of the 21st, inst., in which you ask:

"First—In case a school board admits a pupil from another district, in accordance with sub. 11, page 42, school laws of Oregon, and the board of directors of the districts from which the pupil was transferred refuses to transfer the school money due by apportionment to such child, whose duty is it to authorize the district to transfer the money, and what is the method of procedure?"

"Second—In transferring money from one district to another, after each board has consented to same, does the county superintendent have authority to apportion the said amount direct to the district to which same is to be transferred, without sending it to the original district entitled to same?"

"In answer to first question propounded, permit me to say that the section above referred to makes it the duty of the board of directors of the first district, whenever the parent or guardian of the child shall present a written request, accompanied by a written permit from the board of directors of the adjoining district, to transfer the child, together with all school moneys due by apportionment to such child, to the adjoining district,

or the district to which the child is transferred, and if the board of directors of the first district refuse to transfer the moneys so due to such child, the proper method of procedure would be for the parent or guardian to apply by proper pleadings to the circuit court for a writ of mandamus to compel the board of the first district to pay the same over to the clerk of the adjoining district. A personal right is conferred, and the section therefore is mandatory. Also, I am of the opinion the directors of the district to which the child is transferred could maintain the suit.

"In answer to the second question would say that I find no law to warrant the county superintendent in apportioning the money direct to the district to which the child is transferred; it must first be apportioned to the original district, and then transferred as provided in section 11, page 42, Oregon school laws.

"Section 3, page 17, provides, among other things, that the county superintendent, after making certain apportionments, shall apportion the balance of the fund among the several districts in his county that have reported to him as required by law, in proportion to the total number of children resident in each district between the ages of 4 and 20 years, as is shown by the clerk's last annual report."

"In view of the foregoing, the money would have to be apportioned to the original district, or to the district where he was last enumerated by the clerk in taking the school census. The county school superintendent knows nothing of the transfer, officially. The provision of law is made to notify him, and he cannot act on what he may hear in the matter, but must be governed by the record."

Progress of World's Fair Work.

The installation of figures in the colonnade of states is progressing rapidly. Four are already in place and several more are expected to be installed before the end of this week. The figures in place are those representing Montana, North Dakota, Nebraska and Indian Territory.

North Shore Road.
An Astoria paper Saturday says: A dispatch sent out from Vancouver, Wash., yesterday would indicate the Northern Pacific is actually figuring on building a road on the north side of the Columbia. The dispatch follows:

"That the Washington Railway and Navigation company, said to be the real property of the Northern Pacific, intends to build its line along the north shore of the Columbia river at least to the Cascades, is proven by maps that have been placed on file in the United States land office here. These maps, six in number, show the definite location of the company's line from the mouth of the Columbia river to Kelso, and from Vancouver to the Cascades.

"The length of the road indicated by the maps is 66.6 miles from the sea coast to Kelso and 26.17 from Vancouver to the Cascades, or a total of 92.77 miles. As indicated on the maps filed, the course of the line through the military reservation at Vancouver barracks would be over the Fifth street roadway, passing thence through the city over Fifth street to about F street, where it makes a curve to the north to a junction with the present W. & O. tracks."

The completion of a survey and filing of maps are evidence that the building of a road down the Columbia is at least receiving serious consideration at the hands of Mr. Hill. The report that Harriman is dickering for

the Astoria & Columbia River road also bears the earmarks of truth and the ownership of a railroad on either side of the Columbia by the two magnates is a very reasonable possibility.
