GREEDY LOT OF PORKERS

Trample on Oregon Laws and Law Maker Regardless of His Need at Special Session

But for his presence of mind and quick action our honored representative, I. N. Edwards, would have lost his life last Saturday morning. Mr. Edwards is not only a successful farmer, but is one of this county's leading dealers in hogs, and now has a few hundred swine on his farm north of this city, which he is fattening for market.

As has been his custom every morning he had taken sacks of grain out to the pen where he usually fed the pigs. He entered the enclosure with a sack of feed on his back, and quickly was surrounded by the hungry animals. Before reaching the trough where the feed was to be deposited he accidentally stumbled, and fell across some sharp timbers, his own weight and that of the sack of grain causing him to be knocked almost senseless. The grain was spilled, and 200 or more large hogs made a wild dash for it. Realizing that he would quickly be trampled to death Mr. Edwards mustered all the strength he had remaining, and succeeded in reaching the outer edge of the enclosure, where he sank to the ground exhausted. After a time he was able to reach the house, where he is now recovering. For a time it was feared that he had sustained some broken ribs, but subsequent developments indicate only severe bruises. It was an experience that Mr. Edwards says will never happen to him again, if he can have his way.—Eugene Register.

TRUST REEKS WITH FRAUD

SCHWAB SIMPLY A THIEF

Less Than a Year Ago This Wholesale Swindler and Wall Street Robber Was Held up By Syndicate Writers as An Example of the Selfmade Man, For the American Youth to Pattern After

Sensational allegations of willful misstatements, falsification, swindling and fraud in the organization and flotation of the United States Shipbuilding company, attempts to mislead and deceive the investing public by erroneous prospectus statements, and of a deliberate plan to wreck the company by withholding the earnings of the Bethlehem Steel company, are contained in the report of Receiver James Smith, Jr., of the United States Shipbuilding company, made public here today. The report concludes with the recommendation that suit be brought against all persons who received stock of the company without paying full value thereof, including the promoters of the consolidation, the vendors of the constituent plants and Charles M. Schwab to recover from them such amounts as is necessary to pay the debts of the company in full.

Recommends Sale of Plants.

Receiver Smith also recommends the sale of the Crescent shipyard plant in New Jersey and the Holland Hollingsworth plant at Wilmington, Del., subsidiary plants now in operation to avoid further loss by depreciation, and the enforcement of a receivership for the Bethlehem Steel company

to insure the payment of dividends on the Bethlehem stock held by the United States Shipbuilding company. In the words of the report, the organization of the company is characterized as an "inartistic swindle."

Receiver Smith states that the value of the plants, their earnings and working capital, given in alleged reports of expert accountants, vary so much from actual figures "as to impel the belief that the figures were willfully misstated;" that it is extremely doubtful if such accountants' reports were submitted at the organization of the company; that the organization was effected by dummy stockholders, directors and officers, and that statements in the prospectus issued in June 14, 1902, were incorrect; that for property worth \$12,441,516 the company paid in stocks and bonds \$67,997,000; that "the accommodating directors of the United States Shipbuilding company in acquiring these companies deliberately gave away many million dollars in the stocks and bonds of their company"—"whole-sale plunder," the receiver terms it—to a few persons, and that so far as the Bethlehem Steel company is concerned "its earnings have been withheld in a deliberate attempt to wreck the United States Shipbuilding com-

Purchase of Union Iron Works.

In connection with the purchase of the stock of the Union Iron Works, of San Francisco, Henry T. Scott and Irving M. Scott were to agree to enter into a contract with the shipbuilding company not to compete with it in its business, and not to employ their capital or personally engage in any shipyard or building business for ten years, and the company was to contract to engage G. W. Dickie, R. Forsythe and John T. Scott as officers or managers for five years at annual salaries of \$10,000; W. H. Gould as mining engineer for five years, at \$10,000 per year; Lawrence E. Scott, as assistant constructor, at \$5,000 per annum, for five years; H. M. Scott as assistant to president of the shipbuilding company for five years, at the annual salary of \$5,000; H. A. Scott, as assistant to the engineer-in-chief for five years, at \$3,000 per annum, and Edward Gunn, as assistant chief draughtsman for three years, at \$3,000.

The action of the Bethlehem company in withholding earnings of upward of \$2,000,000 annually was, says the report, "with the apparent purpose of bringing about the destruction of the shipbuilding company."

Charge Against Schwab.

That the execution of the \$10,000,000 mortgage and bond by the Bethlehem company to secure Mr. Schwab at the time of the consolidation is a fraud upon the creditors of the Bethlehem company and otherwise void because of Schwab's control of the directors, the receiver says he is advised.

The report concludes with a discussion of the condition of the constituent companies, showing that the receiver had possession of all but the Bath and Union plants, but claiming that so long as the present board of directors of the Bethlehem company is retained, no benefit will accrue to the receivership from this company. The receiver is convinced that the present interests in control are wholly hostile to the shipbuilding company, are endeavoring to circumvent legal proceedings and that a separate receivership is necessary.
