Corbett in 14 rounds and annexed the Oregon, 12@15c; Mohair, 35@3 championship title. Fitz has been defeated by champion Jim Jeffries in 15 to 15%e 11 and 8 rounds and lost to Tom Sharkey on a foul in 8 rounds. Later he won over the sailor at Concy Island in 2 rounds. George Gardner's Record.

Gardner is a native of County Clare, Ireland; he was born March 17th 1877 and during his ring experience has only lost three contests-one on a foul and two decisions against him. Walcott secured one and was afterwards defeated by Gardner. Gardner's notable victories were:

On October 31, 1902, Gardner was defeated by Jack Johnson in 20 rounds at San Francisco, Jack Root by a foul, in the same city, in 7 rounds and Walcott in 20.
