

He says the statement made in the Bristow report that he bought an excess of \$14,000 worth of cancelling ink in one year-is not true, as the greatest amount ever sold in one year was \$10,000. He admits it was several cents a pound higher, but it was the regular price. Also that the ink, by a secret process, is absolutely indelible, which saves the government thousands of dollars each year, as it effectively prevents the reuse of stamps.


