School Examinations.

State Supt. Ackerman has issued a circular letter of advice to the teachers of the public schools of the state, in which he gives the dates of the next eighth grade final examinations, and other information concerning these examinations. They will be held at four different times in the new year as follows:

- (A), January 27, 28, 29; (B) April 13, 14, 15; (C) May 18, 19, 20; (D) June 15, 16, 17.

The program shows that the several subjects for examinations will be had on the following days:

- (A) Wednesdays—Arithmetic, spelling, physiology.
- (B) Thursdays—Mental Arithmetic, reading, writing, civil government.
- (C) Fridays—Language, history, geography.

Saloon Attached.

The saloon of Fred Neckerman was last evening attached by Sheriff Colbath in a suit brought by William Woodley against Fred Neckerman and wife for the collection of a note for \$200, given on October 6th, last, and payable in monthly installments of \$10 each. The complaint alleges that the defendants had paid the first installment, but had defaulted on the second, and this suit followed. Sheriff Colbath, after taking charge of the place, placed Sam Sauvain, the head bartender, in control to conduct the place pending the settlement or adjudication of the case.

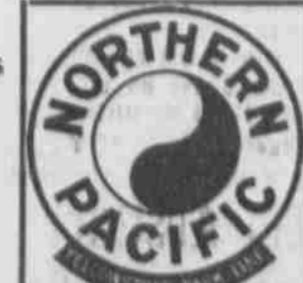
