## COUNCILS CLOSING SESSIONS

### Transact Business and Adjourn to Tuesday Eve

### When Final Business of the Old Council Will Be Closed

At a meeting of the city council last evening Mayor Bishop presided, with Councilmen Burrows, Catlin, Hubbard, Larsen, Pholo, Sims, Stolz and Walker. After approving the minutes of last meeting, Street Commissioner Griswold reported that certain sidewalks in Capital Park on 21st street had been built as directed. That official also reported that the Park Board had asked that a quantity of the mud being taken from the streets be deposited in Willson avenue without cost to facilitate the erection of a fountain. He asked for permission to do this. Stolz opposed the proposition on the theory that it would not be creditable to our city to use its only park as a dumping ground. Mr. Larsen favored filling the section of the park referred to, with some suitable material. Mr. Hubbard moved that the request be not granted. Carried. Mr. Griswold reported that he had new signs lettered for the big steel bridge warning drivers not to drive faster than a walk, and was instructed

Such an ordinance was ordered drawn and the Street Commissioner was authorized to take such further steps as he deemed necessary to collect this road poll tax.

Mr. Sims reported favorably on the petition for certain sewer connection in block 78.

The street committee was granted more time to report upon the claim of the lady recently injured by a defective sidewalk.

Mr. Pholo reported the repaired fire engine restored to service.

Boach & Nadsauck were granted a renewal of liquor license and Mr. Talkington's renewal application was referred.

The official returns of the recent city election, as canvassed by Mayor Bishop and Recorder Judah, were read and approved. Mr. Hubbard offered a resolution approving this report, and recommending that the issue of popular loan bonds be proceeded with. Mr. Stolz offered an amendment providing that the councilmen elect in the new wards who received the largest number of votes should serve for the long term. Adopted as amended. This gives the longer terms to G. B. Jacobs, E. C. Churchill, and Jno. Bayne, and the shorter terms to Young, Smith and Acheson.

Fred Neckerman and Fannie Neckerman asked that their unexpired liquor license be transferred to their successors, the North Pacific Brewing Co. Granted.

Alderman Stolz arose to a question of privilege and took occasion to exonerate Alderman Burrows from the report circulated in the recent city campaign that he had purchased a portion of a lot from the city while alderman. He stated that no man would today be willing to give for it half what Mr. Burrows had paid the city for it. He called attention to the fact that this lot had been advertised for sale at the time and that every possible step had been taken to make the deal regular. He spoke in the highest terms of Mr. Burrows' integrity and moved that the city recorder be asked to give the press of the city all the facts pertaining to this matter fully exonerating Mr. Burrows.

Mr. Hubbard stated that nobody who knows Mr. Burrows believes him to be anything but an honorable gentleman, and, as a friend, he thought it best not to stir up campaign statements which he thought had probably been indulged in too freely on both sides.

Upon motion adjourned to Tuesday evening next.

### Bible Story Made a Myth

New York, Dec. 15.—In a sermon on the life of the late Herbert Spencer, the Rev. Dr. Minot J. Savage, in the Unitarian Church of the Messiah, has given the theory of evolution credit for having "forever destroyed intelligent belief on the part of anybody in the garden of Eden, Adam, Eve or the fall of man." "Evolution," he said, "has forever removed these stories and kindred ones to the land of myth, where they belong."

In concluding his remarks Dr. Savage said:

"Humanity has been on this earth two or three hundred thousand years at least. Humanity, however slowly, has been evolving, and from the far off beginning there never has been any fall. Evolution has wrought out not the fall of man, but the ascent of man. That means the complete reconstruction of the entire theology of Christendom. It is coming, it has got to come. There are thousands of churches today in which the Eden story is quietly referred, as though it were poetry or allegory. There are thousands of others where it is quietly laid to one side."
