

# AN HONORED CITIZEN IS LAID TO REST

## Representative Murphy, of Union County, Was a Loyal Elk and a Member of the Catholic Faith

One of the largest and most impressive funeral services ever conducted in Union county was that of the Hon. T. N. Murphy in La Grande Wednesday morning.

At 10 o'clock many of the friends of the deceased assembled at the opera house where services were conducted under the auspices of the La Grande lodge of Elks, of which Mr. Murphy had been Past Exalted Ruler. The members of the lodge marched from their hall to the opera house, following the casket, the soft low funeral march played by Mrs. Clara T. Lyle. After a few brief remarks by E. W. Bartlett and F. S. Ivanho, Hon. Walter M. Pierce delivered an address, saying in part:

"How little we thought a few days ago we would be called upon to lay away this good man. He was an honest, upright citizen and a true honorable friend, never faltering in his duty. There never was a more kind-hearted man in any community. Why he was taken away so early in life a Higher Power only knows. It shows us what is best to do, fulfill the duties of this short life as near right as is possible. His life was such a better, a nobler, a more honest man never sat in the legislative halls. He was a Christian and a member of one of the great churches. To his bereaved wife we know not what to say. Sorrow too deep for words."

A quartette, consisting of Messrs.

E. S. White, C. S. Williams, I. W. Damon and Thome sang "There is a Land," after which the usual funeral ceremonies of the lodge were concluded. The members of the lodge and friends then viewed the remains. Then the funeral procession proceeded to the Catholic church headed by the members of the Elks lodge in a body. The flowers are beautiful and were taken to the church in the carriage decorated in the lodge colors. Reverend Father Reade conducted funeral services at the church which were largely attended and very impressive. The father spoke of the many good traits of the honored dead, the mysteries and uncertainties of life.

The last sad duty was in the march to the Catholic cemetery where he was laid to rest. "O, Grave where is thy Victory, O Death where is Thy Sting."

The active pall bearers were selected from members of his church as follows: J. H. Pearce, J. E. Foley, Julius Reesch, James M. Murphy, James McCoy and James Garrity, and six of the officers of the Elks lodge were also selected as pall bearers as follows: J. W. Scriber, E. W. Bartlett, J. B. Thorsen, Eugene Schow, Fred Boek and F. J. McCully.

There was much sorrow in the community over the death of this good man and he will be missed for his great worth by the entire community.

Mr. Murphy leaves a widow and a 12-year old daughter at La Grande. His father, P. Murphy, his mother and five sisters, who live in Portland, and two other sisters, Mrs. T. Smith of Spokane and sister, Martha, a teacher in Providence Academy, at Vancouver, Wash., survive him and who have the deep sympathy of many friends.

### Pardoned.

Governor Chamberlain yesterday afternoon pardoned T. E. James, serving a three-year sentence in the penitentiary from Umatilla county, for burglary. James has served 18 months of his time and has been a model prisoner. He is a veteran of the Civil War, and a member of the G. A. R., and the pardon was urged by the G. A. R. post of Pendleton, and many leading citizens of Umatilla county, including a number of the court officials. The pardon was granted in view of the service the old man has rendered his country, and the fact that, in view of his age, he has been sufficiently punished by faithfully serving one-half of the sentence imposed. James left the prison last night for his old home in Pendleton.
