

CONDITION OF SCHOOLS.

Report of the Board of Directors-Will Levy Usual Tax,

The board of directors of the Salem school district met Saturday night and considered the matter of levying a tax. A meeting will be called of the ose of receiving the report of the soard, and levying the tax on the asessment of 1903. The report to be submitted to the meeting of the taxpayers has been prepared, and shows the following details:

Balance on hand June 15th, and receipts\$22,405.24 Disbursements 15,788.97

Balance on hand \$ 6.61627 The estimates for the next year thow that \$12,612 will be required for the next six months to conduct the schools, and, as funds have to be provided for the next year, a tax levy is recommended for this year of seven mills for school purposes, and one mill for payment of the indebtedness This will raise, it is estimated, about \$18,000, and this, together with what is expected from the state and coun ty funds, is believed to be amply sufficient for the coming year.

The present indebtedness of the district is \$31,600, a reduction of \$26,000 since January 1, 1901. In addition to this reduction, the district has made some valuable improvements in naishing and fitting several more rooms in the Park school and renew

The board, in its report, says of the onditions in the schools at this time: "The salaries of principals have been raised from \$70 to \$80 per month The teachers have received a raise of \$5 per month, and the janitors of \$5 per month, making the total raise \$2070 for the year. The crowded condition of the North school made it necessary to employ one more teach-

er in that school at a cost of \$405. "The attendance in the schools for the present year is 1268, against 1205 last year. The Park rehool is in a crowded condition, making it access
