GOOD ROADS LEAGUE

Organized for Business in South Salem

Unanimous Sentiment in Favor of a Broken Rock Street Improvement

There was a good attendance of substantial and progressive citizens at the good roads meeting held Saturday night at the Lincoln school house, in the Seventh ward.

There was unanimous sentiment expressed in favor of a broken rock road to extend from where the Liberty road now ends and the old city limits on Mission street.

A committee on ways and means with full power and authority to act was appointed. The indications are that another year will see a different roadway through the seventh ward.

Roy Ohmart, secretary of the Liberty league, made a statement of their plan of organization. He offered the use of the constitution and by-laws.

Bruce Cunningham spoke of the difficulties they had overcome. The cost of a rock road was not so great as many supposed. A rock road was cheaper at any cost than a gravel road built free.

In Indiana the cost of rock road was \$2800 a mile. It could be done a great deal cheaper here. He favored a track 20 feet wide, the only fault of the Liberty road was it was too narrow.

H. B. Thielson spoke for the State Good Roads Association. Ignorance and indifference were the greatest obstacles to good roads. The loss each two years from bad roads was enough to pay the national debt. With good roads the cost of hauling was cut in two. Marion county needed good roads more than any other, because of the diversified crops. No money would induce the Liberty farmers to go back to their old roads. They could only haul half as much on their wagons after they got into the city as they could on their own roads. The road into the city from the top of the grade at the Parvin drier had a good foundation.

John A. Carson spoke on the county road tax, and discussed whether the seventh ward could get the tax it paid to improve its own road. The county could levy ten mills for road purposes. Our county levied only a mill and a half. He favored following the Liberty plan of raising subscriptions and improving South Commercial street forthwith.

Alderman Bayne stated the provisions of the city charter on streets. It required ten days' notice to be given of the proposed improvement, and if there was no remonstrance the improvement was made at the expense of the abutting property. In original establishment of grades no notice was required to be given.

Mr. Carson suggested that a subscription be raised and that we proceed to build a broken rock road.

Mr. Bayne said that a grade should be first established. He moved that a committee of three, the chairman to be one, be appointed to carry out the wishes of this meeting. Carried.
